Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This is a preliminary draft. An analysis will be provided in a later version.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This draft was prepared for the joint legislative council's special committee on strengthening Wisconsin families.

Under current law, s. 38.04 (21), stats., requires the Wisconsin technical college system (WTCS) board to submit an annual report to the department of administration, department of public instruction, department of workforce development, and to the legislature.

This draft amends s. 38.04 (21), stats., to include data related to adult basic education (ABE) among the information the board is required to include in the annual report.

The draft also requires the board to develop a plan to increase the number of pupils who enroll in diploma or degree programs, who previously completed an ABE program

at a technical college. The plan requires the board to set 5-year goals with annual benchmarks for the number of students who transition from an ABE program to a technical college diploma or degree program.

Under current law, a technical college may require the prerequisite of a high school diploma, general educational development credential (GED), or high school equivalency diploma (HSED) to enroll in technical college diploma and degree programs.

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This draft creates s. 38.04 (32), stats., relating to a concurrent enrollment admissions program. Under the proposed program, the board shall allow pupils to concurrently enroll in a diploma or degree program and an ABE program. The proposed program also allows the board to require a high school diploma, GED, or HSED for enrollment in certain diploma and degree programs.

Under current law, s. 39.435 (1), stats., relating to Wisconsin higher education grants (WHEG) requires half-time enrollment in order for a pupil to be eligible for the higher education grant program.

This draft amends s. 39.435 (1), stats., to remove the requirement of half-time enrollment for higher education grant eligibility under s. 39.435 (1), stats., for students enrolled in the Wisconsin technical college system. The draft amends s. 39.435 (3), stats., relating to the amount of grants under s. 39.435 (1), stats., to reflect the modification of the half-time enrollment requirement under s. 39.435 (1), stats.

The draft also amends s. 39.435 (3), stats., to remove eligibility for grants under s. 39.435 (1), stats., for students who have earned more than 135 credits.

SECTION 1. 38.01 (1) of the statutes is renumbered 38.01 (1m).

SECTION 2. 38.01 (1) of the statutes is created to read:

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38.01 (1) "Adult basic education" includes the following programs: family literacy, general educational development credential and high school equivalency diploma. English as a second language, and workplace education.

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**SECTION 3.** 38.04 (8m) of the statutes is created to read:

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38.04 (8m) ADULT BASIC EDUCATION TRANSITION PLAN. (Annually by January 1, the board shall develop a plan to increase the number of pupils who enroll indiploma associate after completing

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or degree programs, who previously completed an adult basic education program at

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a technical college. The plan shall specify each district board's goals and objectives

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

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
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38.04 (32) CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT. The board shall operate a concurrent enrollment admissions program. Under the concurrent enrollment program, the board shall, by rule, do all of the following:

- a. Develop criteria to determine whether training and coursework requirements for each diploma and degree program are contingent on obtaining a high school diploma, general educational development credential, or high school equivalency diploma.
- b. Identify and approve diploma and degree programs with training and coursework requirements that are contingent on first obtaining a high school diploma, general educational development credential, or high school equivalency diploma.
  - c. Publish a list of diploma and degree programs that satisfy sub. (b).
- d. Except for programs listed under sub. (c), allow pupils to concurrently enroll in a diploma or degree program and an adult basic education program.
- e. Identify and approve adult basic education courses that also satisfy curricula requirements for diploma or degree programs.

SECTION 6. 39.435 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

39.435 (1) There is established, to be administered by the board, a higher education grant program for postsecondary resident students enrolled at least half-time and registered as freshmen, sophomores, juniors or seniors in accredited institutions of higher education or in tribally controlled colleges in this state. The requirement of at least half-time enrollment shalf not apply to students enrolled in the Wisconsin technical college system. Except as authorized under sub. (5), such grants shall be made only to students enrolled in nonprofit public institutions or tribally controlled colleges in this state.





38.04 (21) (A) Pupils attending technical colleges, board report. Annually by the 3rd Monday in February the board shall submit a report to the department of administration, department of public instruction and department of workforce development, and to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2). The report shall specify all of the following by school district:

- (a) The number of pupils who attended district schools under ss. 118.15 (1) (b), (cm) and (d) and 118.55 (7r) in the previous school year.
  - (b) The type and number of credits earned by the pupils.
- (c) The number of persons who applied for admission to a technical college in the previous school year, who previously earned technical college credit under s. 118.55 (7r) and who applied for admission within one year of graduating from high school.
- (d) The courses given in high schools for which a pupil may receive technical college credit and the number of pupils enrolled in the courses for technical college credit in the previous school year.
  - (e) Any other information considered relevant by the board.



The board shall maintain statewide uniformity in the program fees charged for postsecondary and vocational—adult credits. Students 62 years old and over shall be exempted from program fees under this paragraph in vocational—adult programs. Students enrolled in adult high school, including students enrolled under s. 118.15 (1) (cm) 3., adult basic education and English as a 2nd language courses shall be exempted from program fees under this paragraph. 

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
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# DRAFTER'S NOTE FROM THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU

#### Scott:

- 1. Note that I did not modify the Prefatory Note, other than to change "draft" to "bill."
- 2. HEAB's Web site states that WHEG grants, like talent incentive grants, may not be awarded for more than 10 semesters. Section 39.435 (2), stats., however, includes this limitation only for talent incentive grants, not for WHEG grants. HEAB's administrative rules do not mention the limitation at all. In light of the 135 credit limitation created in this draft for WHEG grants, if you want to explicitly state that the 10-semester limitation does not apply to WHEG grants, please let me know.
- 3. I understand that currently there is no "basic education program" in the WTCS, so much of the language in the draft is problematical. The technical colleges offer basic education courses that are remedial or developmental in nature, but one cannot get a degree or diploma in basic education or, for example, English as a second language. One cannot "complete" a basic education program. Similarly, as I understand it, "workplace education" is not a program.
- 4. The definition of "adult basic education" also fails to include many courses that the WTCS considers basic education. These are courses that are primarily remedial or developmental but are not necessarily ESL, family literacy, GED, high school equivalency, or workplace education.
- 5. The draft includes ESL in "basic education," although I understand that many students in ESL classes already have bachelor's degrees. In addition, the inclusion of ESL may make the "transition" data that the bill requires WTCS to report suspect.
- 6. DPI grants GED certificates and high school equivalency diplomas, not WTCS, so in order to report the information required under s. 38.04 (21) (cm), as created in the draft, WTCS will have to get it from DPI.
- 7. Based on our conversation, I changed "adult basic education" in current ss. 38.24 (1m) (b) and 38.27 (1) (a) to "adult basic skills." I think this has the effect of making no substantive change to the two provisions, but you may wish to consult with WTCS to make sure.

Note that I added an initial applicability provision clarifying that the changes made with respect to WHEG grants will first apply to grants awarded for the 2009–10

academic year. Ordinarily, new eligibility criteria for WHEG grants start fresh with a new academic year and are not changed midstream. Given the 13-month delayed effective date and the likelihood that this draft will not be enacted any sooner than this fall as the earliest or, more likely, next spring, it appears that the 2009–10 academic year will be the first academic year commencing after the effective date of the draft.

The board shall maintain statewide uniformity in the program fees charged for postsecondary and vocational-adult credits. Students 62 years old and over shall be exempted from program fees under this paragraph in vocational-adult programs. Students enrolled in adult high school, including students enrolled under s. 118.15 (1) (cm) 3., adult basic education skills, and English as a 2nd language courses shall be exempted from program fees under this paragraph. The board shall establish fees under this paragraph as if students exempt from fees under sub. (4) were not exempt.

**SECTION 8.** 38.27 (1) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

38.27 (1) (a) The creation or expansion of adult high school, adult basic education skills, and English as a 2nd language courses. The board shall give

priority to courses serving minority, unemployed, disadvantaged or handicapped students.

**SECTION 9.** 38.31 of the statutes is created to read:

- 38.31 Concurrent enrollment. (1) The district board shall allow a student to enroll concurrently in a program leading to a certificate of general educational development, a high school equivalency diploma, or a high school diploma, and in a vocational diploma or associate degree program unless the board has determined under sub. (2) that the vocational diploma or associate degree program includes one or more courses that require the student to first obtain a certificate of general educational development, a high school equivalency diploma, or a high school diploma.
- (2) The board shall determine whether enrollment in a vocational diploma or associate degree program requires a student to first obtain a certificate of general educational development, a high school equivalency diploma, or a high school diploma, and shall publish a list of those that do.
- (3) The board shall identify and approve those basic education courses that also satisfy curricular requirements for vocational diploma or associate degree programs.
- (4) The board shall promulgate rules to implement and administer this section, including rules establishing criteria for making the determinations under sub. (2).

**SECTION 10.** 39.435 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

39.435 (1) There is established, to be administered by the board, a higher education grant program for postsecondary resident students enrolled at least half-time and registered as freshmen, sophomores, juniors or seniors in accredited institutions of higher education or in tribally controlled colleges in this state who have earned no more than 135 credits. The requirement of at least half-time

enrollment does not apply to students enrolled in a technical college. Except as authorized under sub. (5), such grants shall be made only to students enrolled in nonprofit public institutions or tribally controlled colleges in this state. There is no limit on the number of consecutive semesters for which a student may receive a grant under this subsection.

**Section 11.** 39.435 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

39.435 (3) Grants under sub. (1) shall not be less than \$250 or the actual cost of fees and tuition, whichever is lower, during any one academic year, unless the joint committee on finance approves an adjustment in the amount of the minimum grant. Grants under sub. (1) shall not exceed \$3,000 during any one academic year. The board shall, by rule, establish a reporting system to periodically provide student economic data and shall promulgate other rules the board deems necessary to assure uniform administration of the program.

**SECTION 12.** 85.107 (3) (am) of the statutes is amended to read:

85.107 (3) (am) Award scholarships of not more than \$2,000 each to any targeted group member who is registered in his or her 2nd year of full-time enrollment in an associate degree program, as defined in s. 38.01 (1) (1m), or vocational diploma program, as defined in s. 38.01 (11), at a technical college in this state.

**Section 13.** 230.22 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

230.22 (3) Subject to s. 230.275, the administrator may establish separate recruitment, evaluation and certification procedures for certain entry professional positions. Vacancies in entry professional positions may be limited to persons with a degree from an institution of higher education, as defined in s. 108.02 (18), or a degree under an associate degree program, as defined in s. 38.01 (1) (1m).

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SECTION	14.	Nonstatutory	provisions.

- (1) The board shall include the initial criteria determined under section 38.31
  (4) of the statutes, as created by this act, and the list of programs under section 38.31
  (2) of the statutes, as created by this act, in the first report under section 38.04 (21)
  of the statutes that is due after the effective date of this subsection.
- (2) The board shall submit in proposed form the rules required under sections 38.04 (8m) and 38.31 of the statutes, as created by this act, to the legislative council staff under section 227.15 (1) of the statutes no later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after publication.

#### SECTION 15. Initial applicability.

- (1) WISCONSIN HIGHER EDUCATION GRANTS. The treatment of section 39.435 (1) and (3) of the statutes first applies to Wisconsin higher education grants awarded by the higher educational aids board for the 2009–10 academic year.
- **SECTION 16. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the first day of the 13th month beginning after publication, except as follows:
  - (1) Section 14 (2) of this act takes effect on the day after publication.
