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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

In the short-term, there is no anticipation of a fiscal effect on individual DA Offices. It is important to note, however, that this bill, if passed, has the potential to incrementally add to the workload in DA Offices. As a result of this bill, there will need to be a hearing to determine whether or not the under-21 year old has successfully completed the sentence or disposition. To make a decision in this regard will require research on the part of the DA's Office. With the new requirement that juvenile sex offenders have lifetime sex offender registration on a retroactive basis, DAs are encountering numerous requests by young adults to have their records cleared or cases dismissed.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Currently, data is unavailable to determine if there would be a long-range fiscal effect resulting from the implementation of this bill. However, it would be worthwhile to review the data on a regular basis if the bill is passed. It also is important to consider the cumulative effect that this and other legislation could have on DA Office workloads. Though one bill may not add significantly to the workload of a DA Office, when considered along with other bills, the cumulative effect may be significant and could require additional Assistant District Attorneys.
