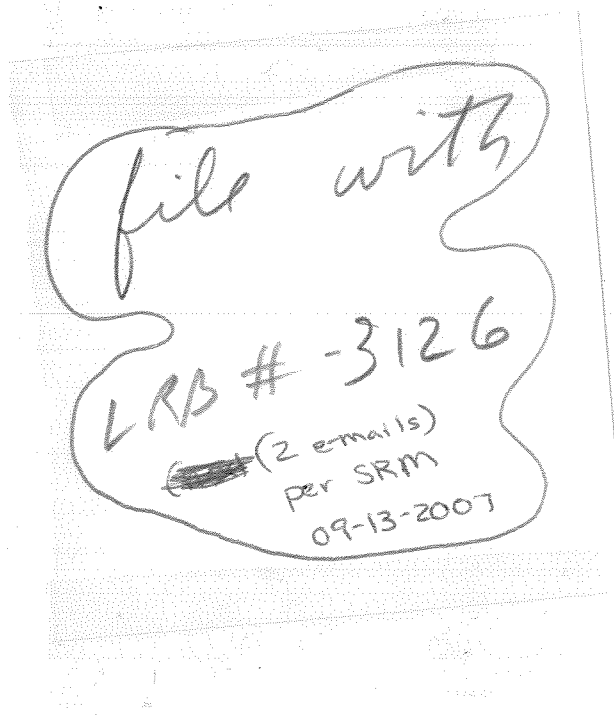

I am absolutely confident that passage of one or more piecemeal budget bills for the 2007-09 fiscal biennium would not require an emergency statement under s. 16.47 (2). In s. 16.47 (1) and (1m), there is mention of both a budget bill and budget bills. The statutes clearly contemplate that the "budget bill" can be one or more bills. These piecemeal budget bills would constitute the biennial budget for the 2007-09 fiscal biennium. All that would need to be done is make clear in the relating clause that the bill relates to state finances and appropriations for ... [state the policy area] ... for the 2007 legislature.



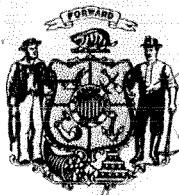

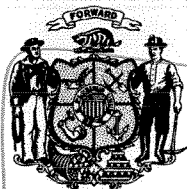
