Robin,

Rep. Gunderson needs an amendment drafted for AB 672 for an Executive Session next Wednesday. The amendment needs to:

1) A problem which exists under current law which could be corrected by this bill but is not, is the fact that under the provisions of s. 29.304(3)(b)3., and s. 984.60(3), Stats., a person that is 14 or 15 years of age may hunt or target practice with a firearm if they are certified under the hunter education program.

But, a person who is 16 or 17 years of age may not target practice alone, even if they hold a hunter education certification. A 16 or 17 year old may hunt alone with a firearm if they hold a hunter education certificate, but may not target practice alone. They must be supervised by an adult to target practice with a firearm.

2) Please remove the requirement that the DNR provide a pamphlet on hunter's safety.

- 3) Under this bill a person ages 10 or 11, would also now be allowed to possess a firearm to hunt on a Deer Hunting Preserve or Bird Hunting Preserve, or to hunt certain small game animals on their parents land. But under this mentorship requirement, they would be required to hold a hunting approval. Hunting approvals are not required for hunting on such preserves, or for kids hunt rabbits, squirrels, raccoons, coyotes, foxes, woodchucks and beaver on their parents land. No exception is made for situations where a hunting approval is not required for the person doing the hunting. While this does not create any safety concerns, and would in fact likely result in some additional revenue for the department, we do not believe this was the intent of this bill, or that it is necessary. It could add to confusion for landowners and hunters hunting on preserves, not knowing they need a license when others do not.
- 4) Establish a delayed effective date that reads something like: "This act first applies 0 × to approvals issued on July 1, 2008."
 - 5) Finally, add in that if the Department decides to lower the hunting age after looking at the safety data that it must be done through the Administrative Rule process.

Mike, thanks for the opportunity to look this over. We do have concerns with 2 parts. I have provided our recommended modifications to this amendment language and a short explanation of why we feel these changes are necessary.

Let me know if you have any questions.

At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

- **1.** Page 10, line 8: delete lines 8 to 12.
- **2.** Page 10, line 18: after that line insert:

"(7) This section does Subsections (1)(b) and (2)(e) do not apply to a person who is not required to hold a hunting

approval under s. 29.337, 95.55(5) or 169.19(5) this chapter.".

This change is needed to clarify who and where the mentor and mentored hunter would not need a hunting license, and continue to make the mentorship program an option for hunting on hunting preserves and under landowner authority. It appears that the draft language would not allow a person to hunt under the mentorship program if they were hunting in a situation that would not otherwise require a hunting approval. This would mean no one age 10 or 11, or anyone 12 or older born after 1-1-73 without hunter education certification, would be able to hunt on there own land or these preserves, even if mentored. We believe the above modified language makes it clear that just the hunting license requirement of the mentorship program would not apply in these hunting

situations.

3. Page 12, line 2: after that line insert:

"SECTION 38. Initial applicability.

(1) This act first applies to hunting approvals issued on the first day of the 3rd month after publication. July 1, 2008, or the day after the effective date of this subsection, whichever occurs later.".

I talked with Diane Brookbank and she feels this change is needed to assure our Customer Service & Licensing Bureau has at least 3 months from the time we know the law has been passed to make the needed changes.

I also talked with our legal staff on the target practicing issue we raised regarding 16 and 17 year olds, and the comments provided by Robin Kite. We are comfortable just leaving this one alone.
