This bill increases the uniform fees charged for technical college collegiate transfer courses from at least 31 percent of statewide average operational costs for such programs to at least 42 percent in 2009–10 and to at least 50 percent in 2010–11 and thereafter. In addition, beginning in 2009 each district board with a collegiate transfer program coursely only Madison, Milwaukee, and Nicolett must reduce its property tax levy by an amount equal to the additional revenue generated in that year as a result of the higher fees for collegiate transfer courses.
