Dear Lisa,

Here is the structure of Ducks Unlimited:

Ducks Unlimited Inc. is a 501c(3) non-profit organization headquartered in Memphis. Founded in 1937, we have grown to be the 110th largest non-profit in the country. There is a national board of directors. National officers consist of Chairman, President, First Vice Pres., Secretary, Exec. Secretary & Exec. Vice President. In addition there are a number of Sr. Vice Presidents and Regional Vice Presidents along with At-Large Board Members. These folks conduct the affairs of Ducks Unlimited on a national basis. All are volunteers with the exception of the Exec. Secretary & Exec. Vice President.

Each state has a separate volunteer organization led by a State Chairman and State Treasurer. Those positions are required by our by-laws. Other state level officers exist for various functions. These folks carry out the affairs of Ducks Unlimited fund-raising within the state. Conservation work is carried by our professional staff.

Each local chapter is chartered by the national organization and is under the supervision of the state organization, i.e. the State Chairman.

Currently in Wisconsin each chapter must apply for a raffle license (A & B) for their local fundraising events. It is our desire to consolidate the process for the approximate 250 chapters for the state organization so that 1 license (A& B) could be held for all chapters. It is paperwork nightmare for us and we want to avoid any problems with chapters failing to purchase the appropriate license.

Under current law, a not-for-profit, religious, charitable, service, fraternal, or veterans organization that serves a geographic area that is limited to Wisconsin and that has existed for at least one year or is chartered by a state or national organization that has existed for at least three years may obtain a license to conduct raffles. The fee for a raffle license is \$25. An organization holding a raffle license may conduct up to 200 raffles in a 12-month period.

This bill provides that an organization that satisfies the criteria for obtaining a raffle license, is chartered by a state or national organization, and is supervised by an organization that holds a raffle license may conduct raffles under the supervising organization's license. Under the bill, each organization that is authorized to conduct a raffle may conduct up to 200 raffles in a 12-month period.

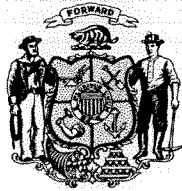
