

## 2007 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 38

March 27, 2007 – Introduced by Representatives HIXSON and JORGENSEN,  
cosponsored by Senator ROBSON. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1     **Relating to:** honoring Bob Berezowitz’s coaching career at the University of  
2             Wisconsin–Whitewater.

3             Whereas, June 2007 will mark the end of Bob Berezowitz’s illustrious 22–year  
4     career as coach of the University of Wisconsin–Whitewater Warhawks football team;  
5     and

6             Whereas, Bob Berezowitz began his head coaching duties with the University  
7     of Wisconsin–Whitewater in 1985; and

8             Whereas, throughout his distinguished career, Bob Berezowitz led the  
9     University of Wisconsin–Whitewater Warhawks to 158 wins, the third highest  
10    victory total in the history of the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference  
11    (WIAC); and

12            Whereas, Bob Berezowitz’s accomplishments include coaching eight WIAC  
13    Championships, with five National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) playoff  
14    appearances, and two appearances in the NCAA Division III championship game;  
15    and

1           Whereas, Bob Berezowitz was honored as American Football Coaches  
2 Association (AFCA) Division III National Coach of the Year in 2005, AFCA Regional  
3 Coach of the Year four times, Wisconsin College Coach of the Year two times, and  
4 WIAC Coach of the Year seven times; and

5           Whereas, Bob Berezowitz has been elected to the University of  
6 Wisconsin–Whitewater Athletics Hall of Fame, National Association of  
7 Intercollegiate Athletics District 14 Hall of Fame, and Wisconsin Football Coaches  
8 Association (WFCA) Hall of Fame; and

9           Whereas, through his expertise and leadership, Bob Berezowitz has coached  
10 young men to all–American honors 64 times; and

11           Whereas, Bob Berezowitz was selected to be a coach for the AFCA All–Star  
12 Team to compete against international competition in Japan; and

13           Whereas, Bob Berezowitz was an Associated Press Small College All–American  
14 quarterback who led the UW–Whitewater football team to a second place finish in  
15 the 1966 National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) championship,  
16 giving him the unique distinction of having played and coached in the national  
17 championship game; and

18           Whereas, Bob Berezowitz was honored by Wisconsin Governor Jim Doyle who  
19 proclaimed Saturday, November 4, 2006, as Bob Berezowitz Day; and

20           Whereas, Bob Berezowitz coached his last game for UW–Whitewater on  
21 Saturday, December 16, 2006, in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, the NCAA Division  
22 III Championship; and

23           Whereas, the legacy Bob Berezowitz will leave behind in the memories of his  
24 staff, players, and fans, will serve as an example of leadership and dedication for all  
25 who follow; now therefore, be it
