Whereas, Taiwan and the United States enjoy one of the most important economic and strategic international relationships; and

Whereas, together, Taiwan and the United States promote a shared faith and respect for freedom, democracy, and fair trade; and

Whereas, Taiwan and the United States have hand-in-hand to preserve peace and stability within the Asia-Pacific region and to help improve the lives of their citizens and people around the world; and

Whereas, trade between Taiwan and the United States has increased significantly during the past decades, with the United States being Taiwan's second largest source of imports and Taiwan being eight largest trading partner of the United States; and

Whereas, Taiwan is a major trading partner with the United States and also an important overseas market for United States agricultural products, and given the remarkable economic performance of Taiwan and the strong purchasing power of its twenty-three million people, there are many opportunities to further expand bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan; and

Whereas, streamlined foreign investment procedures developed under a Taiwan-United States free trade agreement would lead to further investment by firms in both Taiwan and the United States and would create new business opportunities and new jobs; and

Whereas, a Taiwan-United States free trade agreement would encourage greater innovations and manufacturing efficiencies by stimulating joint technological development, practical applications, and new cooperative ventures; and

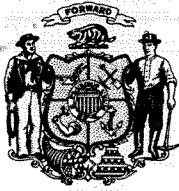
Whereas, a recent study by the United States International Trade Commission
