(no P) and the issuance of retail alcohol beverage licenses for premises on which another business is conducted

INSERT ANAL:

Current law prohibits, with certain exceptions including hotels, restaurants, and bowling centers, the issuance of a Class "B" license or permit for any premises where another business is conducted. However, this prohibition does not apply if the other business and the Class "B" premises are connected by a "secondary doorway" a safety exit ~~which~~ is not the primary entrance to the Class "B" premises. A Class "B" license authorizes the retail sale of beer for consumption on or off the premises.

This bill creates an exception to this prohibition for a batting cage facility.
