Rep. Gunderson would like an Assembly Substitute Amendment drafted for Senate Bill 197 which does the following:

- 1. Removes the restriction on displaying phosphorus containing fertilizer, and add that if an entity that sells fertilizers decides to display fertilizer that contains phosphorus; they must post a sign with a minimum size of 8 ½" by 11" that states: Phosphorus is known to cause pollution in our waters. Use of phosphorus is prohibited except when establishing grass on new lawns and on lawns that have a deficiency in phosphorus that is determined by a soil test. Violations may be subject to a fine under ss 94.643.
- 2. Creation of a statewide preemption on local municipalities creating ordinances that regulate phosphorus containing fertilizer.
- 3. The amendment should put all bio-solids on equal footing, so they have the same legal status in statute.


