

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Transportation (DOT) erects tourist-oriented directional signs to assist motorists traveling along highways. Tourist-oriented directional signs provide identification of and directional information for tourist-related businesses, services, or activities, which derive the majority of their income or visitors during the normal business season from motorists not residing in the immediate area where the business, service, or activity is located.

This bill requires DOT, after consultation with the Milwaukee Art Museum and upon receiving an application and applicable fees, to erect 21 tourist-oriented directional signs related to downtown lakefront attractions in the city of Milwaukee. Seven of these signs must display the word "lakefront" and a logo adopted by the city of Milwaukee and must be placed at certain locations along one side of specified highways approaching the downtown lakefront of the city of Milwaukee. √ The remaining 14 signs, one on each side of the highway displaying the name and logo of seven lakefront attractions, must be erected along the highway under DOT's jurisdiction closest to the lakefront attraction displayed on the sign, at or near the exit ramp providing the most convenient access to the attraction.

required for the erection of tourist-oriented directional signs, shall erect signs in the city of Milwaukee meeting the specifications under section 86.196 of the statutes, and rules promulgated under that section, for the Milwaukee Art Museum, the Betty Brinn Children's Museum, Discovery World Pier Wisconsin, Summerfest, Lakeshore State Park, the War Memorial Center, and the McKinley Marina. Each sign shall display the name and logo of the lakefront attraction to which the sign provides directional information. After consultation with the Milwaukee Art Museum regarding sign placement, the department shall erect two signs, one for each direction of travel, for each of these lakefront attractions along the highway under the department's jurisdiction closest to the lakefront attraction displayed on the sign, at or near the exit ramp providing the most convenient access to the attraction.

I have drafted these provisions as nonstatutory provisions, which is common for bills requiring DOT to do things like erect signs. Nonstatutory provisions are typically used for matters that have a limited duration. Technically, the bill requires DOT to erect the specified signs within the current biennium but would allow DOT to remove the signs at some point in the future. As a practical matter, it is unlikely that DOT would remove the signs once the biennium expires, but DOT might decline to conduct any maintenance of the signs. If you prefer, I can place these provisions in a statutory unit in ch. 86 and require maintenance of the signs as well. ✓

Because this bill requires the erection of signs in the right-of-way of federal-aid highways, I recommend that DOT review the bill to advise whether the erection of such signs would affect the amount of federal highway funds or federal incentive payments received by the state.


