At our meeting this morning, we discussed amending the community advisory committee statutes in the following ways:

- Committees would have to be established for adult family homes (licensed and certified).
- If a CBRF or adult family home changes client groups, it would have to notify DHFS and the community advisory committee at least 30 days in advance and get DHFS approval. [DHFS notification and approval is already required by rule, but this would put it in the statutes. ss. HFS 83.07(2)(b), 83.11(3)(c), and 88.03(2)(b)2.]
- Committees would have to be notified in advance of license renewal dates. [It probably makes sense to have them notified at the same time that the facility is notified that its license needs to be renewed.]
- DHFS would be required to seek input from committees, and consider and respond in writing to any input given, for initial licenses, license renewal, and change in client groups.

All of these changes could be made to the current community advisory committee statute for adult facilities--s. 50.03(4)(g). In addition, you might want to consider whether to apply the

last 3 bullet points to the community advisory committee statute for children's facilities--s. 48.68(4).
