This bill makes a number of changes to the regulation of dietitians.

## Licensure and use of titles

Under current law, a person may be certified as a dietitian by the Dietitians Affiliated Credentialing Board (board) in the Department of Regulation and Licensing (DRL). With certain exceptions, current law prohibits a person who is not certified by the board from designating himself or herself as a dietitian, claiming to provide dietetic services, or using any title or initial that would represent that person as certified or licensed as a dietitian or in a nutrition-related field.

"Dietitian" is defined under current law as an individual who practices dietetics, which is defined to mean the integration and application of principles from nutritional science, biochemistry, food systems management, and other fields in order to achieve or maintain the health of an individual or group of individuals. "Dietetics" is further defined under current law to include assessing the nutritional needs of an individual or group of individuals; establishing priorities, goals and objectives to meet those nutritional needs; and providing nutritional counseling.

This bill changes the definition of "dietitian" to mean a person who practices dietetics and nutrition care services. The bill defines "dietetics and nutrition care services" to mean the integration and application of principles derived from the sciences of food, nutrition, management, communication, biology, physiology, behavior, and the social sciences to achieve and maintain optimal human health. The bill defines the "practice of dietetics and nutrition care services" to exclude the retail sale of food products or vitamins, but to include: 1) the assessment of the nutritional needs of an individual or group of individuals; 2) establishing priorities, goals, and objectives to meet these nutritional needs; and 3) medical nutrition therapy. The bill defines "medical nutrition therapy" as nutritional diagnostic services, therapy, and counseling services provided for the purpose of managing persons as a licensed dietitian or nutritionist disease.

The bill directs the board to license, not certify, distitions. The bill prohibits a person who is not licensed from practicing dietetics or nutrition care services. The bill also prohibits, with certain exceptions, a person who is not licensed by the board from using any of the following titles or initials: dietitian, certified dietitian, licensed dietitian, nutritionist, certified nutritionist, licensed nutritionist, dietitian and nutritionist, certified dietitian and nutritionist, licensed dietitian and nutritionist. nutrition consultant, nutritional consultant, L.D., L.N., L.D.N., or any title or initials that may tend to represent that the person is certified or licensed as a dietitian or in a nutrition-related field.

Requirements for licensure by the board

To be certified as a dietitian under current law, a person must do all of the following:

1. Receive a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in certain fields, including human nutrition, nutrition education, and food system management, received from a college or university that the board determines is regionally accredited. If the college or university is not located in the United States, the program must be substantially equivalent to a program offered by a regionally accredited college or university. Alternatively, a person may receive a degree from a program approved by the board.

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2. Complete at least 900 supervised hours of dietetics practice.

3. Pass the registration examination, or its equivalent, established by the American Dietetic Association (ADA).

Under current law, a person who has satisfied the educational and practice requirements described above, and who has applied to take the next available examination, may obtain a temporary dietitian certificate.

Under the bill, to be licensed by the board, an individual must do all of the following:

1. Possess a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree granted from a regionally accredited college or university and complete a didactic program in dietetics approved by the ADA. If the college or university is not located in the United States, the board must determine that the educational program is substantially equivalent to the ADA-approved program.

2. Complete 900 supervised practice hours under a supervised practice

program accredited by the ADA.

3. Pass the registration examination for dietitians established by the ADA.

Under the bill, a person who satisfies the educational and practice requirements described above, and who submits a letter from the ADA verifying that person's registration eligibility status, may obtain a temporary license.

The bill requires an applicant for renewal of a license to provide DRL with the following: 1) proof of registration with the ADA; and 2) satisfactory completion of continuing education requirements established by the board by rule.

## Exemptions from licensure

Current law exempts a person who is licensed or certified and lawfully practicing as any of the following from obtaining certification from the board provided the person practices within the scope of his or her license or certificate and does not claim to be a dietitian or licensed in a nutrition-related field: nurses, chiropractors, dentists, physicians, physical therapists, podiatrists, athletic trainers, occupational therapists, optometrists, pharmacists, acupuncturists, nursing home administrators, and persons to whom a practice or procedure is delegated by any of the above. In addition, current law exempts the following from obtaining certification from the board: 1) persons who are pursuing a degree or certificate from an educational program approved by the board; 2) a dietetic technician or assistant working under the supervision of a certified dietitian; 3) a dietitian serving in the U.S. armed forces; and 4) a person who markets or distributes food and other goods, who explains the use, benefits, or preparation of food and other goods, and who furnishes nutritional information about food and other goods provided that person does not claim to be a dietitian or certified dietitian and that , or nutritionist person complies with applicable law.

Under the bill, only the following persons do not need to obtain a license from the board: 1) a physician; 2) a dietitian serving in the U.S. armed forces; 3) a licensed chiropractor who has obtained nutritional counseling certification; 4) a retailer that furnishes oral or written general nutrition information about food and other goods in connection with the marketing and distribution of those goods; 5) a person who is not practicing dietetics and nutrition care services who provides general nutrition

information about food and other goods; and 6) a person who provides weight control services under a program of instruction approved in writing by a licensed dietitian, a physician, or a person registered as a dietitian with the ADA.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill makes a number of changes to the regulation of dietitians.

## Licensure and use of titles

Under current law, a person may be certified as a dietitian by the Dietitians Affiliated Credentialing Board (board) in the Department of Regulation and Licensing (DRL). With certain exceptions, current law prohibits a person who is not certified by the board from designating himself or herself as a dietitian, claiming to provide dietetic services, or using any title or initial that would represent that person as certified or licensed as a dietitian or in a nutrition-related field.

"Dietitian" is defined under current law as an individual who practices dietetics, which is defined to mean the integration and application of principles from nutritional science, biochemistry, food systems management, and other fields in order to achieve or maintain the health of an individual or group of individuals. "Dietetics" is further defined under current law to include assessing the nutritional needs of an individual or group of individuals; establishing priorities, goals and objectives to meet those nutritional needs; and providing nutritional counseling.

This bill changes the title of a person licensed by the board from "dietitian" to "dietitian or nutritionist," and defines a dietitian or nutritionist as a person who practices dietetics and nutrition care services. The bill also changes the title of the board to the Dietetics and Nutrition Care ervices Affiliated Credentialing Board. The bill defines "dietetics and nutrition care services" to mean the integration and application of principles derived from the sciences of food, nutrition, management, communication, biology, physiology, behavior, and the social sciences to achieve and maintain optimal human health. The bill defines the "practice of dietetics and nutrition care services" to exclude the retail sale of food products or vitamins, but to include: 1) the assessment of the nutritional needs of an individual or group of individuals; 2) establishing priorities, goals, and objectives to meet these nutritional needs; and 3) medical nutrition therapy. The bill defines "medical nutrition therapy" as nutritional diagnostic services, therapy, and counseling services provided for the purpose of managing disease.

The bill directs the board to license, not certify, persons as a licensed dietitian or nutritionist. The bill prohibits a person who is not licensed from practicing dietetics or nutrition care services. The bill also prohibits, with certain exceptions, a person who is not licensed by the board from using any of the following titles or initials: dietitian, certified dietitian, licensed dietitian, nutritionist, certified nutritionist, licensed nutritionist, dietitian and nutritionist, certified dietitian and nutritionist, licensed dietitian and nutritionist, nutrition consultant, nutritional consultant, L.D., L.N., L.D.N., or any title or initials that may tend to represent that the person is certified or licensed as a dietitian or in a nutrition-related field.

#### Requirements for licensure by the board

To be certified as a dietitian or nutritionist under current law, a person must do all of the following:

- 1. Receive a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in certain fields, including human nutrition, nutrition education, and food system management, received from a college or university that the board determines is regionally accredited. If the college or university is not located in the United States, the degree must be substantially equivalent to a degree offered by a regionally accredited college or university. Alternatively, a person may receive a degree from a program approved by the board.
  - 2. Complete at least 900 supervised hours of dietetics practice.
- 3. Pass the registration examination, or its equivalent, established by the American Dietetic Association (ADA).

Under current law, a person who has satisfied the educational and practice requirements described above, and who has applied to take the next available examination, may obtain a temporary dietitian certificate.

Under the bill, to be licensed by the board, an individual must do all of the following:

- 1. Possess a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree granted from a regionally accredited college or university and complete a didactic program in dietetics approved by the ADA. If the college or university is not located in the United States, the board must determine that the educational program is substantially equivalent to the ADA-approved program.
- 2. Complete 900 supervised practice hours under a supervised practice program accredited by the ADA.
  - 3. Pass the registration examination for dietitians established by the ADA.

Under the bill, a person who satisfies the educational and practice requirements described above, and who submits a letter from the ADA verifying that person's registration eligibility status, may obtain a temporary license.

The bill requires an applicant for renewal of a license to provide DRL with the following: 1) proof of registration with the ADA; and 2) satisfactory completion of continuing education requirements established by the board by rule.

## Exemptions from licensure

Current law exempts a person who is licensed or certified and lawfully practicing as any of the following from obtaining certification from the board provided the person practices within the scope of his or her license or certificate and does not claim to be a dietitian or licensed in a nutrition-related field: nurses, chiropractors, dentists, physicians, physical therapists, podiatrists, athletic trainers, occupational therapists, optometrists, pharmacists, acupuncturists, nursing home administrators, and persons to whom a practice or procedure is delegated by any of the above. In addition, current law exempts the following from obtaining certification from the board: 1) persons who are pursuing a degree or certificate from an educational program approved by the board; 2) a dietetic technician or assistant working under the supervision of a certified dietitian; 3) a dietitian serving in the U.S. armed forces; and 4) a person who markets or distributes

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food and other goods, who explains the use, benefits, or preparation of food and other goods, and who furnishes nutritional information about food and other goods provided that person does not claim to be a dietitian or certified dietitian and that person complies with applicable law.

Under the bill, only the following persons do not need to obtain a license from the board: 1) a physician; 2) a dietitian or nutritionist serving in the U.S. armed forces; 3) a licensed chiropractor who has obtained nutritional counseling certification; 4) a retailer that furnishes oral or written general nutrition information about food and other goods in connection with the marketing and distribution of those goods; 5) a person who is not practicing dietetics and nutrition care services who provides general nutrition information about food and other goods; and 6) a person who provides weight control services under a program of instruction approved in writing by a licensed dietitian, a physician, or a person registered as a dietitian with the ADA.

One more response to your proposed changes to the bill. This, from Joan Pleuss:

We are thrilled with the drafter's quick response to our requested changes, yet have one more suggestion which might be the preference of the drafter as well.

Re: the "student dietitian" section which the drafter proposed to leave unchanged, we'd like to suggest another alternative: deleting the entire section. Since these students are clearly exempted from the requirements of this statute in 448.72 (9), we believe this section spelling out what a student may call him/herself (448.76 (2)) is not necessary. One additional reason we would prefer this option in lieu of leaving 448.76 (2) as it was just brought to our attention. One could read the current wording in a way that translates to mean the student could call him/herself a "dietitian" or a "nutritionist student".

I have reviewed and addressed all of the typos and changes to the draft as requested by Ms. Pleuss with one exception:

Ms. Pleuss requests that, under s. 448.76 (2), the title that may be used by a dietetic student be changed to "dietitian student" rather than "dietitian or nutritionist student". I did not make this change. The language of this section is permissive, meaning that a dietitian student may, under this section, be referred to as a "dietitian or nutritionist student" without running afoul of the licensing laws. However, this section also permits the student to use any other title (such as "dietitian student") so long as the person identifies him or herself as a student. For that reason, I don't believe we need to change this section.

Also, please advise Ms. Pleuss that the language under s. 448.78 (3) (b) will read: "Possesses a bachelor's masters, or doctoral degree granted by a college or university that is not located in the United States if an <u>independent agency approved</u> by the registration commission has determined that the degree is substantially equivalent to a degree granted under par. (a)."

Finally, please apologize to Ms. Pleuss for the typographical errors - these are unacceptable. In addition, I apologize for failing to modify the analysis to reflect the changes to the statutory language.

Our editing and proofing sections have reduced staff through the new year; for that reason, the draft may not be ready until after that point.

The Wisconsin Dietetic Association is very pleased with the detailed revision of the introducible licensure bill draft received December 18, 2007. Upon thorough review of the draft, we found just 3 typos, four requested minor wording changes in the bill draft, and three requested simple changes in the LRB Analysis to make this overview congruent with changes already included in the bill draft. They are listed below.

For the sake of advancing our bill through the legislative process, we would appreciate your prompt response in compiling a final draft.

Typos:

- 1. Page 4, line 4: "dietitians" should be lined out so that the sentence reads, "There is created in the department of regulation and licensing, attached to the medical examining board, a dietetics and nutrition care services affiliated credentialing board. . ." instead of ". . . a dietitians dietetics and nutrition care services credentialing board. . ."
- 2. Page 8, line 23: The new title of 448.71, as clarified in the drafters 11/13/07 questions and comments, should read "License required" rather than "Licensed required."
- 3. Page 13, line 25: Line through the word "from" so that the sentence reads, "Possesses a bachelor's master's or doctoral degree granted by a college or university . . ." rather than "Possesses a bachelor's master's or doctoral degree from granted by a college or university . . ."

#### **Requested Wording Changes in Bill Draft:**

- 1. On page 13, Lines 4-6, 448.76 (7) specifies the title to be used by dietitians or nutritionists with a temporary license. We had previously requested "registry eligible dietitian," as this reflects their status with the registration commission as being nearly registered as a registered dietitian. Since that credential is not "registered dietitian or nutritionist" but simply "registered dietitian", we'd prefer that this term be left as previously requested ("registry eligible dietitian") if possible. If this is not possible, we could live with the revision.
- 2. Page 10, line 4: Using the same line of reasoning, we'd prefer that the title used for a dietetic student in 448.76 (2) be "dietitian student" rather than "dietitian or nutritionist student."
- 3. Page 13, line 20: Please replace "approved" with "accredited" in 448.78 (3) so that the sentence finishes, "... and successfully completes a didactic program in dietetics accredited by the accreditation commission."
- 4. Page 14, line 1: To further clarify that neither the affiliated credentialing board nor the registration commission determine foreign degree equivalency, please reword 448.78 (3)(b) to read, "Possesses a bachelor's, master's or doctoral degree granted by a college or university that is not located in the United States if an outside agency accepted by the registration commission has determined that the degree is substantially equivalent to a degree granted under par. (a)."

## Changes to "Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau"

- 1. Page 2, last sentence of the second to the last paragraph: Please delete the first "services" in this sentence so that it reads, "The bill defines "medical nutrition therapy" as nutritional diagnostic, therapy, and counseling services provided for the purpose of managing disease." This is the same change we previously requested and were granted for the MNT definition, now found on page 8, line 1. To leave worded as "... nutritional diagnostic services" inappropriately sounds as if we are conducting or providing lab work or testing (which we are not) which could alarm legislators, physicians or other health care professionals reading the overview.
- 2. Page 3, sentence immediately preceding "Exemptions from licensure": Please change "and" to "or" in the middle of this sentence so that it reads, "The bill requires an applicant for renewal of a license to provide DRL with the following: proof of 1) registration with the ADA; or 2) satisfactory completion of continuing education requirements established by the board by rule." The rational for this change was explained in WDA's 11/16/07 response; i.e., non-RD CDs who become LDNs via the grandfathering

clause will not be required to show proof of registration with the registration commission. We appreciate that the drafter has already made the necessary change to 448.86 (3) in the current bill draft (page 16, lines 17 - 24) to reflect this nuance.

3. Page 3, middle of page, second sentence of point #1: Please correct this sentence so that it reads, "If the college or university is not located in the United States, the academic degree must be deemed equivalent to the degree granted by a United States regionally accredited college or university."
