relating to operating a motor wehicle while intoxicated

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who violates state law or a local ordinance prohibiting the operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant or with a prohibited blood alcohol concentration is subject to having his or her operating privileges suspended or revoked. The duration of the suspension or revocation depends upon how many times the person has violated the state law or local ordinance and ranges from 6 months to three years

This bill prohibits a person whose operating privileges have been suspended or revoked for a violation relating to operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated from purchasing a motor vehicle while his or her operating privileges are suspended. Under the bill, if a person whose operating privileges have been suspended or revoked has an occupational license that allows him or her to operate a vehicle in order to maintain a job or education, that person may purchase a motor vehicle as long as the occupational license is in effect.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a
