Tracy -

I just got a call from John Vander Meer in Hebl's office. He wants a redraft of his world languages bill, LRB-3650. He started telling me what he wanted before I realized it was your draft, so I just went ahead and took the instructions. Here they are:

- He wants to allow gifts and grants to be used for the same purpose as the GPR grants. (Or, as he put it, he wants "private corporations to be able to contribute to the fund."
- He wants to make sure that the money isn't used for ESL programs. I suggested changing "world languages" to "foreign languages," but he'd prefer to add "other than English" on page 2, line 13 after "languages." I think that works too.
- Do a senate companion bill for Lassa. He suggested calling Danielle for authorization.

I asked about the first item. It seems to me that since DPI already has a gifts and grants appropriation, nothing needs to be done. John said that both of the additions come from Lassa's office and the person to talk to is Danielle.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill directs the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to award grants to school districts to add instruction in world languages in grades one to six. Under the bill, a school board may apply for a six-year grant to pay for a portion of the compensation of up to two teachers and to phase in world languages instruction in grades one to six.

The bill directs DPI to establish criteria for awarding a grant and requires teachers from participating schools to attend professional development workshops to be offered by DPI twice each year. A component of the professional development program will be methods for integrating the world language into the curricula of other classes taught concurrently with the world language.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
