## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

SB 489 will reduce the number of issues that might be confronted by a Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission mediator in police/firefighter bargaining units but that potential reduction will have no discernable fiscal impact on the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission.

SB 489 will reduce local government costs in those instances in which an employee is suspended or terminated as a result of being charged with a misdemeanor or felony and such a suspension or termination is upheld.
