Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Up to 300 W-2 participants per year will attend technical college for 12 months as allowed under this bill. Those individuals will be placed in a Community Service Job and will receive a monthly benefit payment of \$673 per month. Currently, the average length of stay in a CSJ is 4 months. The additional 8 months will require an additional, \$1,615,200 in W-2 benefits. W-2 service expenditures are projected to increase by \$662,640, which includes \$32,640 for transportation and \$630,000 for case management, tuition and fees for some, attendance tracking, ancillary supports, etc. Fifteen percent for administration expenses on the total increase cost is \$401,972. Costs associated with modifying the Client Assistance for Reemployment and Economic Support (CARES)system are projected to be \$4000 (50 hours *\$83/ hour to add a new activity and update federal and state reporting.)

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

As more individuals learn of the opportunity to attend a technical college program through the W-2 program the numbers may increase. However, the investment is likely to result in higher wages and fewer people returning to the program once they've completed the technical college program.
