Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The Wisconsin Works (W-2) program under current law provides work experience and benefits for low-income custodial parents who are at least 18 years old. Also, an individual who is the parent of a child under the age of 13 or, if the child is disabled, under the age of 19, is eligible for a child care subsidy under the W-2 program if the individual needs child care services to participate in various educational or work activities and satisfies other eligibility criteria. One of those criteria is that the individual's family income may not exceed 185 percent of the poverty line. If an individual is already receiving a child care subsidy, however, their family income may be as high as 200 percent of the poverty line before they lose eligibility. This bill increases those maximum family income levels to 210 percent of poverty for an individual who is first applying for a child care subsidy and to 225 percent of poverty for an individual who is already receiving a subsidy.
