Barb, after our phone conversation, I got the statutes out and reviewed the incentive grants program. I think you may need to make a few more decisions. Under s. 38.27, there are a number of provisions that apply to certain types of grants, and I'm not sure whether to apply them to the grants for welding programs. I'll summarize the program:

There are seven types of grants:

(a) The creation or expansion of adult high school and ESL courses.

(b) The creation or expansion of programs that address emerging skills.

(c) The purchase or lease of high-cost instructional equipment for occupational training programs.

(d) Programs that foster classroom instruction for apprentices and upgrading of journeymen.

(e) Educational programs that would not otherwise be established because of lack of funds.

(g) Programs that assist business and industry in adopting and implementing new technology.

(h) The creation or expansion of programs at secured juvenile correctional facilities.

And here are the various provisos:

Amounts awarded for (b), (c), (d), and (g) must range from 25% to 75% of total project costs.

Amounts awarded for (a) or (e) may be awarded on a continuing basis.

Amounts awarded to support the establishment of new programs under (b) or (g) may be awarded for a period of up to 3 years.

Funds received by a district for (a), (b), (c), (d), or (g) may not be used to supplant funds otherwise available for such purposes.

No more than \$1,500,000 may be awarded annually for (e).

No more than 25% of the total amount awarded under the incentive grants program in any fiscal year may be for (c). At least \$1,500,000 must be awarded annually for adult literacy programs under (a) (in addition to the amount awarded in 1988-89).

Annually, \$100,000 must be awarded under (b) for nurse training programs.

No more than \$150,000 may be awarded annually for (h).

Do you want to include the welding program grants in any of the above provisos? Do you want a new proviso for the welding program grants? Perhaps instead of separating out welding as a new area for grants, it might be better to require that at least \$5,000,000 be awarded annually under paragraph (pick whichever paragraph is the most appropriate) for welding programs.

### 2007 BILL

AN ACT to create 38.27 (2m) (g) of the statutes; relating to: incentive grants
technical college district boards for training in advanced manufacturing skil

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill directs the Wisconsin Technical College System Board to award to technical college district boards at least \$5,000,000 annually in incentive grants for training in advanced manufacturing skills, with priority given to welding.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3	<b>SECTION 1.</b> 38.27 (2m) (g) of the statutes is created to read:
4	38.27 (2m) (g) Beginning in the 2008-09 school year, at least \$5,000,000
5	annually is awarded under sub. (1) (b) 1. for training in advanced manufacturing
6	skills, with priority given to welding.

SECTION 2. Fiscal changes.

BILL

(1) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the technical college system board under section 20.292 (1) (dc) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2007, the dollar amount is increased by \$5,000,000 for fiscal year 2008–09 to increase funding for grants to technical college districts under section 38.27 (1) (b) 1. of the statutes.
