Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Passage of this legislation would require the department to revise DWD 290 to adopt regulations concerning under what circumstances unions could submit wage information on behalf of union contractors. The department anticipates the rule change would involve minimal costs that the department could absorb.

Implementation of SB 526 would require the department to make major changes to its computer software system commonly called [PWARS] and that the cost of revamping this system would cost present a one time cost to the department of \$50,000.
