Proposal Revised/Updated Definition for Plumbing (Chapter 145 – Wisconsin Statutes)

Current Law:

Plumbing is defined in the state statutes in Chapter 145.01(10).

The Issue:

The definition of plumbing has not been reviewed and updated in some time. The Plumbing Advisory Code Council, which meets under the auspices of the Safety & Buildings Division of the Department of Commerce, recently reviewed the definition and recommended that it be revised/updated.

The Plumbing Advisory Code Council noted that several changes were needed to clarify the definition. By way of example, the current definition includes "water softeners" but that definition does not reflect the full array of products that are installed by the industry (reverse osmosis systems, iron filters, etc.). Those items would be better described using the recommended language, "water treatment devices."

The Plumbing Advisory Code Council also noted that several changes were needed to reflect new technologies and a better understanding of the effects of stormwater runoff on the contamination and pollution of our public bodies of water. By way of example, the current definition of plumbing does not contemplate water reuse technologies. Water reuse technologies include systems for capturing wastewater and stormwater, treating that water on-site, and reusing that water to serve the property in instances where non-potable (not for human consumption) water is not required – flushing a toilet or irrigating a lawn, for instance.

The Proposed Solution:

Modify the language in Chapter 145.01(10) as recommended on the attached and throughout the statutes as necessary.


The intention of the proposed language is to have the definition updated so as to better reflect the current practices within the industry and to better protect our state's residents and our bodies of water from pollution and contamination.

Ch. 145.01 (10) PLUMBING. "Plumbing" means and includes:


- (a) All piping, fixtures, appliances, equipment, devices and appurtenances in connection with the water supply systems, water distribution systems, wastewater and drainage systems, wastewater reuse systems, and stormwater use systems including, but not limited to hot water storage tanks, water softeners treatment devices and water heaters connected with such water and drainage systems and also includes the installation thereof.
- (b) The construction, connection or installation of any drain or waste wastewater piping system from the outside or proposed outside foundation walls of any building to the mains or other sewage system terminal within bounds of, or beneath an area subject to easement for highway purposes, including private sewage systems and stormwater treatment and dispersal systems, and the alteration of any such systems, drains or wastewater piping.
- (c) The water service piping from the outside or proposed outside foundation walls of any building to the main or other water utility service terminal within bounds of, or beneath an area subject to easement for highway purposes and its connections.
- (d) The water pressure system other than municipal systems as provided in Ch. 281.
- (e) A plumbing and drainage system so designed and vent piping so installed as to keep the air within the system in free circulation and movement; to prevent with a margin of safety unequal air pressures of such force as might blow, siphon or affect trap seals, or retard the discharge from plumbing fixtures, or permit sewer air to escape into the building; to prohibit cross—connection, contamination or pollution of the potable water supply and distribution systems; and to provide an adequate supply of water to properly serve, cleanse and operate all fixtures, equipment, appurtenances and appliances served by the plumbing system.

AN ACT to renumber 145.01 (10) (d); to renumber and amend 145.01 (10) (intro.), 145.01 (10) (a), 145.01 (10) (b), 145.01 (10) (c) and 145.01 (10) (e); to amend 145.01 (3m) and 145.14 (2) (b); and to create 145.01 (10) (br) of the statutes; relating to: the definition of plumbing.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill makes changes in the definition of "plumbing," as it is defined for purposes of the statutory provisions relating to plumbing that are administered by the Department of Commerce. The changes include the following:

- 1. Changing the definition in certain aspects to include systems that treat or process wastewater and stormwater.
- 2. Eliminating references that limit the scope of the definition to piping that runs from the outside of foundations of a building to water mains and terminals.
- 3. Eliminating references that limit the scope of the definition to potable water supply systems.
- 4. Updating references to water softeners to include other types of water treatment devices.

For further information see the **state** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
