Property bill requires the Department of Transportation (DOT) to develop and administer a child safety program to provide information to the public about potential vehicle hazards to children who are under eight years of age. The program must include information on risks to children left unattended in vehicles and on ways in which parents and caregivers can reduce risks to children related to backover incidents and accidental activation of power windows. DOT must promulgate rules to implement and administer the program.

The bill also requires DOT to establish and maintain a database of injuries and deaths in off-highway accidents involving light motor vehicles, which are those weighing 10,000 pounds or less, not including motorcycles. The bill defines an "off-highway accident" as an event causing injury or death to a child under the age of eight that results from any movement, device, or function of a light motor vehicle and that does not involve the collision of the light motor vehicle with another vehicle

or object or a single-vehicle rollover of the vehicle. This database must be available to the public and must include specified information.

The bill requires law enforcement agencies that respond to an emergency call related to an off-highway accident to report to DOT: 1) the age of each child involved in the accident; 2) if the accident did not result in death, the type of injury resulting from the accident; 3) the cause of injury or death resulting from the accident and any pertinent circumstances relating to the injury or death; and 4) the make, model, and model year of the light motor vehicle involved in the accident and the relationship, if any, between the owner of the vehicle and the child involved in the accident. If a fire department, emergency medical technician, or other first responder responds to an emergency call related to an off-highway accident and no law enforcement agency responds to the emergency call, the first to arrive at the scene of the accident must provide to DOT this same information.

The bill also requires the Department of Public Instruction (DPI), in consultation with the Technical College System Board and DOT, to conduct a study of whether and to what extent driver education courses include course instruction on the risks to children left unattended in vehicles and the risks to children relating to backover incidents and accidental activation of power windows. DPI must submit a report summarizing the results of this study to the legislature by July 1, 2009.
