1            **Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That:**

2            **SECTION 1. 2007-2008 Session schedule.** (1) BIENNIAL SESSION PERIOD. The  
3 legislature declares that the biennial session period of the 2007 Wisconsin  
4 legislature began on Wednesday, January 3, 2007, and that the biennial session  
5 period ends at 12 noon on Monday, January 5, 2009.

6            (2) BUDGET DEADLINE. The deadline for introduction of the executive budget bill  
7 or bills, submittal of the state budget report, and delivery of the governor's budget  
8 message is Tuesday, January 30, 2007, as provided by section 16.45 of the statutes.

9            (3) SCHEDULED FLOORPERIODS AND COMMITTEE WORK PERIODS. (a) *Unreserved*  
10 *days.* Unless reserved under this subsection as a day to conduct an organizational  
11 meeting or to be part of a scheduled floorperiod of the legislature, every day of the  
12 biennial session period is designated as a day for committee activity and is available  
13 to extend a scheduled floorperiod, convene an extraordinary session, or take senate  
14 action on appointments as permitted by joint rule 81.

15            (b) *Inauguration.* Pursuant to section 13.02 (1) of the statutes, the  
16 inauguration of the members of the 2007 legislature, and the organizing for business  
17 of the 2 houses, commences at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, January 3, 2007.

18            (c) *Floorperiod.* A floorperiod commences on Tuesday, January 9, 2007, at 10  
19 a.m., and ends on January 9, 2007.

1 (d) *Floorperiod.* A floorperiod commences on Tuesday, January 23, 2007, at 10  
2 a.m., and, unless adjourned earlier, ends on Thursday, February 1, 2007.

3 (e) *Floorperiod.* A floorperiod commences on Tuesday, February 13, 2007, at  
4 10 a.m., and, unless adjourned earlier, ends on Thursday, February 22, 2007.

5 (f) *Floorperiod.* A floorperiod commences on Tuesday, March 13, 2007, at 10

9 (h) *Bills to governor.* No later than Thursday, May 3, 2007, at 4:30 p.m., the  
10 chief clerk of each house shall submit to the governor for executive action thereon all  
11 enrolled bills originating in the chief clerk's house and having been passed by both  
12 houses, in regular, extraordinary, or special session, on or before April 27, 2007.

13 (i) *Floorperiod.* A floorperiod commences on Tuesday, May 8, 2007, at 10 a.m.,  
14 and, unless adjourned earlier, ends on Thursday, May 17, 2007.

15 (j) *Floorperiod.* A floorperiod commences on Tuesday, May 29, 2007, at 10 a.m.,  
16 and, unless adjourned earlier, ends on Friday, June 29, 2007, but this floorperiod may  
17 not be adjourned until the general fund executive budget bill has been passed by both  
18 houses.

19 (k) *Nonbudget bills to governor.* No later than Thursday, August 9, 2007, at 4:30  
20 p.m., the chief clerk of each house shall submit to the governor for executive action  
21 thereon all enrolled bills, except the general fund executive budget bill, originating  
22 in the chief clerk's house and having been passed by both houses, in regular,  
23 extraordinary, or special session, on or before August 3, 2007.

24 (L) *Budget bill to governor.* No later than the later of Thursday, August 9, 2007,  
25 at 4:30 p.m., or 4:30 p.m on the 4th Thursday after the general fund executive budget

1 bill is passed by both houses in identical form, the chief clerk of each house shall  
2 submit to the governor for executive action thereon any enrolled general fund  
3 executive budget bill originating in the chief clerk's house and having been passed  
4 by both houses, in regular, extraordinary, or special session.

2 constitute final adjournment of the special or extraordinary session.

3 (b) *Bills to governor.* No later than 4:30 p.m. on the first Thursday occurring  
4 2 full weeks after the day a bill is passed by both houses in identical form after June  
5 6, 2008, in special or extraordinary session, the chief clerk of the house in which it  
6 originated shall submit it to the governor for executive action thereon.

7 (c) *Veto review.* A special or extraordinary session shall reconvene upon a call  
8 of a majority of the members of the joint committee on legislative organization solely  
9 for the consideration of executive vetoes or partial vetoes if an enrolled bill passed  
10 by both houses during the special or extraordinary session was vetoed or partially  
11 vetoed.

12 (6) **END OF TERM.** The biennial term of the 2007 legislature ends on Monday,  
13 January 5, 2009. Pursuant to section 13.02 (1) of the statutes, the inauguration of  
14 the members of the 2009 legislature will be on Monday, January 5, 2009.

15 **SECTION 2. Notice of 2009 session organization.** Notice is hereby given that  
16 the biennial session of the 2009 legislature will hold its first meeting, pursuant to  
17 section 13.02 (1) of the statutes, on Monday, January 5, 2009, and that the meeting  
18 will begin at 2 p.m.

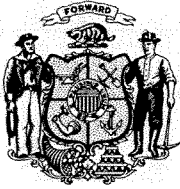

24 constitute final adjournment of the special or extraordinary session.

1 (b) *Bills to governor.* No later than 4:30 p.m. on the first Thursday occurring  
2 2 full weeks after the day a bill is passed by both houses in identical form after June  
3 6, 2008, in special or extraordinary session, the chief clerk of the house in which it  
4 originated shall submit it to the governor for executive action thereon.

5 (c) *Veto review.* A special or extraordinary session shall reconvene upon a call  
6 of a majority of the members of the joint committee on legislative organization solely  
7 for the consideration of executive vetoes or partial vetoes if an enrolled bill passed  
8 by both houses during the special or extraordinary session was vetoed or partially  
9 vetoed.

10 (6) **END OF TERM.** The biennial term of the 2007 legislature ends on Monday,  
11 January 5, 2009. Pursuant to section 13.02 (1) of the statutes, the inauguration of  
12 the members of the 2009 legislature will be on Monday, January 5, 2009.

13 **SECTION 2. Notice of 2009 session organization.** Notice is hereby given that  
14 the biennial session of the 2009 legislature will hold its first meeting, pursuant to  
15 section 13.02 (1) of the statutes, on Monday, January 5, 2009, and that the meeting  
16 will begin at 2 p.m.
