# 2005 SENATE RESOLUTION

Soon

March 21, 2006—Introduced by Senators Leibham and Grothman. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

**Relating to:** state sovereignty Whereas, the 10th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States as follows. "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people"; 5 and Whereas, the 10th Amendment defines the total scope of federal power as being 6 only that specifically granted by the U.S. Constitution and no more; and Whereas, the scope of power defined by the 10th Amendment means that the federal government was created by the states specifically to be an agent of the states; 10 and Whereas, today the states are demonstrably treated as agents of the federal 11 12 government; and Whereas, numerous resolutions opposing federal encroachment on state powers have been forwarded to the federal government by the legislature without but has received no any response or result from Congress or the federal government; and

	Whereas, many federal mandates are directly in violation of the 10th					
2	Amendment to the Constitution of the United States and					
3	Whereas, the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled in <i>New York v. United States, 112</i>					
4	S. Ct. 2408 (1992) that Congress may not simply commandeer the legislative and					
5	regulatory processes of the states; and					
6	Whereas, a number of federal proposals from previous administrations and					
7	some now pending from the present administration and from Congress may further					
8	violate the U.S. Constitution: now, therefore, be it					
9	Resolved by the senate, That the state of Wisconsin bereby claims					
10	sovereignty under the 10th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over					
11	all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government by the					
12	U.S. Constitution; and, be it further					
13	Resolved, That adoption of this resolution does not constitute an application					
14	by the legislature of the state of Wisconsin for the calling of a federal Constitutional					
15	Convention within the meaning of Article V of the U.S. Constitution; and, be it					
16	further					
17	Resolved, That this resolution shall serve as notice and demand to the federal					
18	government, as our agent, to cease and desist, effective immediately, mandates that					
19	are beyond the scope of its constitutionally delegated powers; and, be it further					
20	<b>Resolved, That</b> the senate chief clerk shall provide copies of this resolution to					
21	the President of the United States, the speaker of the U.S. house of representatives,					
22	the presiding officer of each house of each state legislature of the United States, and					
23	each member of this state's congressional delegation.
