

## 2007 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 23

March 9, 2007 – Introduced by Senators JAUCH, LAZICH, MILLER, ERPENBACH, ROESSLER, WIRCH, OLSEN, RISSER and DARLING, cosponsored by Representatives SHERMAN, TRAVIS, JESKEWITZ, ZIEGELBAUER, HEBL, KERKMAN, HAHN, BERCEAU, PETROWSKI, MURSAU, BOYLE and SINICKI. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1     **Relating to:** commending Jolene Anderson, member of the University of  
2           Wisconsin–Madison Badger women’s basketball team, for her athletic  
3           achievements.

4           Whereas, Jolene Anderson was born on July 22, 1986; grew up in Port Wing,  
5     Wisconsin; and attended South Shore High School, where she was a three–sport  
6     athlete in basketball, track, and volleyball, and in basketball was named the state  
7     of Wisconsin’s all–time leading scorer as a senior and led her team to the WIAA State  
8     Division 4 final; and

9           Whereas, as a high school junior, Jolene Anderson was recruited by many top  
10    colleges, but she committed to the University of Wisconsin–Madison to further her  
11    basketball and academic career, over final considerations for Minnesota and  
12    Marquette; and

13           Whereas, in her rookie year, Jolene Anderson was named University of  
14    Wisconsin–Madison’s leading scorer, was a leader in rebounds and assists, was

1 named 2005 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, was the third-highest scoring freshman  
2 in the nation, and won a gold medal as a member of the USA U19 team; and

3 Whereas, in 2006, Jolene Anderson returned in her sophomore season to be  
4 named second team All-Big Ten by Big-Ten coaches and the media, became the  
5 University of Wisconsin's first player, male or female, to score 1,000 points by her  
6 57th career game, led the University of Wisconsin-Madison in rebounding, and  
7 earned a second USA team gold with the USA U20 team; and

8 Whereas, now in her junior year at the University of Wisconsin-Madison,  
9 Jolene Anderson has been named first team All-Big Ten by Big Ten coaches and  
10 media panels, she continues to lead the Badgers in scoring and rebounding, and she  
11 is only the ninth player in the history of the University of Wisconsin program to be  
12 named to the Big Ten's first team; and

13 Whereas, Jolene Anderson is a great asset to the University of  
14 Wisconsin-Madison women's basketball team and a promising contributor to  
15 another season in the future of University of Wisconsin basketball; now, therefore,  
16 be it

17 ***Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That*** the members of the  
18 Wisconsin legislature salute Jolene Anderson for her many achievements in the  
19 game of basketball.
