



2007 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 33

1 **Relating to:** honoring the University of Wisconsin–Madison men’s track and field
2 team.

3 Whereas, the University of Wisconsin–Madison men’s track and field team won
4 the 2007 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Indoor Championship on
5 March 10, 2007, in Fayetteville, Arkansas; and

6 Whereas, the Badgers scored 40 points to win its first NCAA title in track and
7 field and the first ever national championship in track and field for a Big Ten
8 Conference school; and

9 Whereas, the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association
10 named Head Coach Ed Nuttycombe the Division I Indoor Men’s Coach of the Year
11 after he led the Badgers to the national title and their seventh–consecutive Big Ten
12 championship; and

13 Whereas, senior Chris Solinsky from Stevens Point, Wisconsin, who scored 18
14 of the Badgers’ 40 points, broke the school record in the 3,000 meter event and was

1 later named the Division I Men’s Track Athlete of the Year by the U.S. Track and
2 Field and Cross Country Coaches Association; and

3 Whereas, senior Joe Detmer, Lodi, Wisconsin native, broke his own record for
4 total points in the heptathlon and a world record in the 1,000 meter event; now,
5 therefore, be it

6 ***Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That*** the members of the
7 Wisconsin legislature honor the University of Wisconsin–Madison men’s track and
8 field team, Head Coach Ed Nuttycombe, assistant coaches, athletic department staff,
9 and the student–athletes for a record–breaking season and a well–deserved national
10 championship.
