Whereas, in 1957, the Treaty of Rome created the European Economic Community, which was the first pillar of European unity; and

Whereas, in 1992, the Maastricht Treaty formally integrated the European Union by creating the second and third pillars of common foreign and security policy, and police and judicial cooperation; and

Whereas, the European Union includes 27 member nations and has adopted procedures for the orderly accession of new members; and

Whereas, the European Union has established a parliament, a judicial system, and has normalized trade and monetary policy among its members; and
