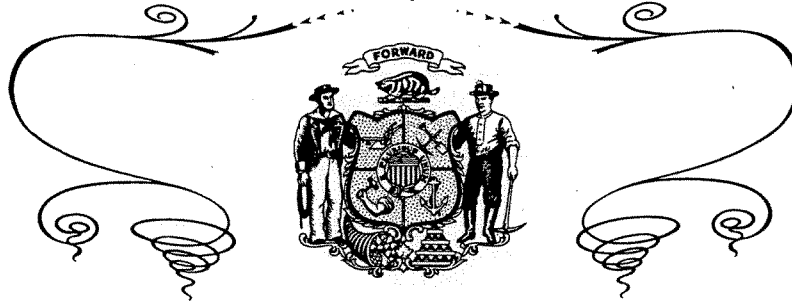

Dampier, of Merrill, Wisconsin, a member of the 1st Battalion, 8th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Heavy Brigade Combat Team of Fort Carson, Colorado, proudly and faithfully served the people of Wisconsin and the United States with distinction and honor in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom; and

Whereas, Specialist Grant A. Dampier was a wrestler for, and year 2000 graduate of, Merrill High School, worked for Marathon Electric in Wausau, and enjoyed the Green Bay Packers, off-road truck racing, and fishing; and

Whereas, Specialist Grant A. Dampier loved his family, wife Heidi and 3 daughters Alexis, Starr, and Kylee, he took great delight in fishing with his daughters on the Wisconsin River, and enlisted in the United States Army in September of 2004 in order that his daughters would look up to him and be proud of their father; and

Whereas, Specialist Grant A. Dampier is survived by his wife Heidi, his daughters Alexis, Starr, and Kylee, his mother and stepfather Karen and Pat Goulee of Merrill, his father and stepmother Richard and Gwen Dampier of Mosinee, his brother and sister Jamie and Rae Ann Dampier, and 5 half-brothers and one half-sister; and
