## **2007 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 47**

May 3, 2007 – Introduced by Senators A. LASEE, SCHULTZ and LEIBHAM, cosponsored by Representatives Gronemus, M. Williams, Gottlieb, Kreuser, Schneider, Molepske and Garthwaite. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1	<b>Relating to:</b> supporting a Taiwan–United States free trade agreement.
2	Whereas, Taiwan and the United States enjoy one of the most important
3	economic and strategic international relationships; and
4	Whereas, together, Taiwan and the United States promote a faith and respect
5	for freedom, democracy, and fair trade; and
6	Whereas, Taiwan and the United States have worked hand-in-hand to
7	preserve peace and stability within Asia–Pacific and to help improve the lives of their
8	citizens and people around the world; and
9	Whereas, trade between Taiwan and the United States has increased
10	significantly during the past decades, with the United States being Taiwan's
11	second-largest source of imports and Taiwan being the eighth largest trading
12	partner of the United States; and
13	Whereas, Taiwan is a major trading partner with the United States and an
14	important overseas market for United States agricultural products; given the
15	remarkable economic performance of Taiwan and the strong purchasing power of its

1 23 million people, there are many opportunities to further expand bilateral trade 2 between the United States and Taiwan; and 3 Whereas, streamlined foreign investment procedures developed under a 4 Taiwan–United States free trade agreement would lead to further investment by 5 firms in both Taiwan and the United States and would create new business 6 opportunities and new jobs; and 7 Whereas, a Taiwan–United States free trade agreement would encourage 8 greater innovations and manufacturing efficiencies by stimulating joint 9 technological development, practical applications, and new cooperative ventures; and 10 11 Whereas, a recent study by the United States International Trade Commission 12 supports the negotiation of a Taiwan–United States free trade agreement to further 13 boost trade between the two countries and serve the broader interests of the United 14 States in Asia–Pacific; now, therefore, be it 15 **Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That** the members of the 16 Wisconsin assembly support the negotiation of a Taiwan–United States free trade 17 agreement; and, be it further 18 *Resolved, That* the senate chief clerk shall provide a copy of this resolution to 19 the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Chicago, Illinois. 20 (END)
