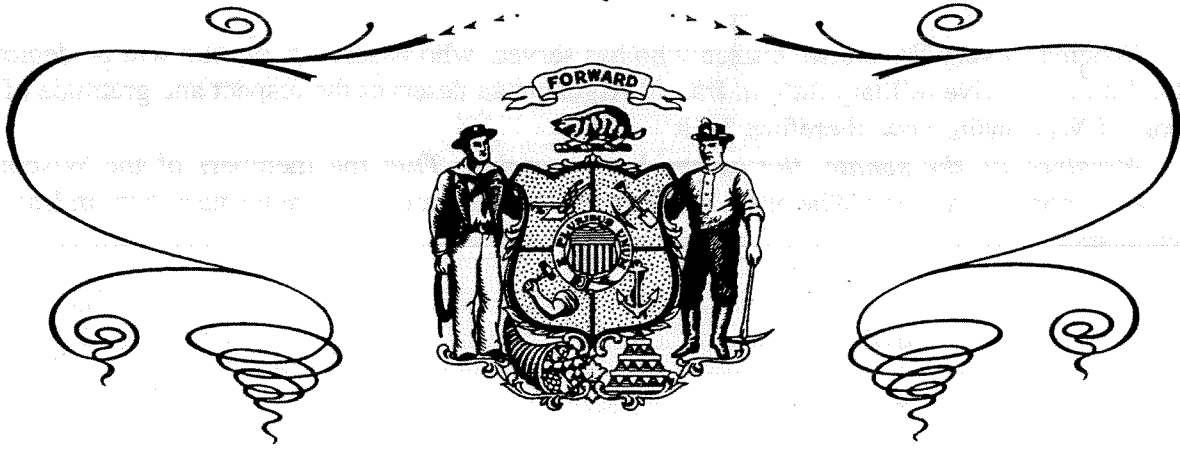

ENROLLED JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to: honoring Wisconsinites called up to active military duty.

Whereas, thousands of citizens of the state of Wisconsin have faithfully and dutifully fulfilled their military commitments while being deployed to active military duty in Iraq and Afghanistan; and

Whereas, of the thousands of Wisconsin residents who are serving or have served in Iraq and Afghanistan, many are now doing or have completed their second and third tours in Iraq and Afghanistan; and

Whereas, many Wisconsin service members have returned from their tours in Iraq and Afghanistan having been wounded, some suffering from traumatic brain injuries, traumatic amputations, and acute post-traumatic stress disorders; and

Whereas, many Wisconsin service members returning home from their tours in Iraq and Afghanistan have been awarded Silver Stars, Bronze Stars, and Purple Hearts; and

Whereas, these citizens have done so with the unending support of their families and loved ones who are left behind, with those loved ones, friends and the communities nurturing the young children left behind, supporting the spouses left to care for families on their own, and caring for the parents, siblings, and other relatives and concerned individuals who are left behind with concern and worry; and

Whereas, these Wisconsin citizens have come from every walk of life: teachers, police officers, and convenience store clerks to state government cabinet secretaries — all resolutely fulfilling their duties, often suffering in adverse living conditions, facing the dangers of war every minute of every day, often times at reduced pay than they would have been receiving at their regular jobs at home; and
