Whereas, while in the Wisconsin state senate, Ronald G. Parys was noted for sponsoring key bills, such as the state lottery, and promoting equality, fairness, and personal responsibility; and

Whereas, during retirement, Ronald G. Parys remained interested in politics and was a member on the Punta Gorda Zoning Appeals Board; and
