Whereas, the son of Jesse and Nettie Kincaid, Lloyd H. Kincaid graduated from Crandon High School and worked as a cabinetmaker, meat cutter and grocery businessman; and

Whereas, Lloyd H. Kincaid served in the United States Army during World War II from 1943-1945; and

Whereas, Lloyd H. Kincaid is survived by his wife of 55 years, Kathleen "Trink" Kincaid, and children David, Jim, John and Sandy as well as nine grandchildren, six great-grandchildren, and by his sisters and brothers; and

Whereas, Lloyd H. Kincaid was the epitome of public servant, working as a member of the local technical college board, his city council and county board; and
