

2007 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 89

February 12, 2008 – Introduced by Senators PLALE, S. FITZGERALD, HANSEN, LEHMAN, DARLING, VINEHOUT and SULLIVAN, cosponsored by Representatives J. FITZGERALD, SHERIDAN, MUSSER, TURNER, OWENS, TOWNSEND, MOLEPSKE, BIES, HAHN, KESTELL and ZEPNICK. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1 **Relating to:** proclaiming March of every year as Irish–American Heritage Month.

2 Whereas, America has been shaped by the principles of liberty and freedom,
3 guided by the pursuit of justice, and enriched by the diversity of its people, and Irish
4 Americans have been an essential part of this development, greatly contributing to
5 our nation’s and state’s progress and prosperity; and

6 Whereas, since the founding of our nation, millions of Irish have emigrated to
7 this country, and to Wisconsin, to embrace the vibrant promise of new opportunity
8 that America offers; and

9 Whereas, some came seeking the freedom to worship as they pleased, while
10 others came in the wake of the devastating Irish potato famine of 1845–1849, which
11 caused 1 million deaths in Ireland and led to the emigration of nearly 1.5 million
12 Irish; and

13 Whereas, this convergence of cultures contributed to the rich fabric of our great
14 state and nation, uniquely threading together many divergent ideas, tastes, and
15 traditions; and
