Whereas, Sgt. 1st Class Lance S. Cornett was born July 11, 1972, in San Diego, California, and died on Feb. 3, 2006, from injuries sustained while engaging the enemy during a firefight in the vicinity of Ar Ramadi, Iraq; and

Whereas, Sgt. 1st Class Cornett graduated from Laurel County High School in London, Kentucky and entered the United States Army as an infantryman on Aug. 13, 1991, and after completion of initial entry training, was assigned to the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 3rd Battalion, 14th Infantry Brigade, 10th Mountain Division; and

Whereas, Sgt. 1st Class Cornett also served in 6th Battalion, 101st Aviation Regiment, 101st Airborne Division; F Company, 51st Infantry Long Range Surveillance Detachment, 519th Military Intelligence Battalion; Delta Company, 4th Ranger Training Brigade and Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 4th Ranger Training Brigade, and was assigned to the United States Army Special Operations Command, Fort Bragg, N.C. in May of 2004; and

Whereas, Sgt. 1st Class Cornett was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for valor (2), the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal (4), the Army Achievement Medal (9), the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, the Army Good Conduct Medal (4), the National Defense Service Medal with bronze service star, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal with bronze service star, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Global War On Terrorism Service Medal, the Noncommissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon with numeral three, the Army Service Ribbon, the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Expert Infantryman Badge, the Master Parachutist Badge, the Pathfinder Badge, the Military Freefall Jumpmaster Badge, the Air Assault Badge, the Sapper Tab, the Ranger Tab, the Special Operations Diver Badge, and was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star Medal for valor, the Purple Heart and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal; and
