February 12, 2007 – Introduced by Senators Lassa, Miller, Schultz, Darling, Roessler, Taylor, Kreitlow and Coggs. Referred to Committee on Public Health, Senior Issues, Long Term Care and Privacy.

| 4  | Whereas, unwise lifestyle choices are a significant cause of cancer, diabetes,      |
| 5  | chronic lung disease, hypertension, heart disease, stroke, and accidental death and |
| 6  | injury and contribute to the morbidity and disability resulting from numerous other |
| 7  | chronic diseases; and   |
| 8  | Whereas, the combined national cost for the morbidity, mortality, and disability    |
| 9  | caused by preventable obesity, smoking, substance abuse, and seat belt neglect      |
| 10 | exceeds \$400,000,000 annually (25 percent of all health spending); and             |
| 11 | Whereas, obesity alone has become epidemic in America and in Wisconsin,             |
| 12 | having doubled in the past 20 years and now affecting 21 percent of the adult       |
| 13 | population; and   |
| 14 | Whereas, the cultural shift necessary to reverse these trends and inspire           |
| 15 | healthful lifestyles will require the broad participation of social leaders,        |

communities, and institutions, particularly schools; employers; health
 professionals; and government; and

Whereas, the Institute of Medicine published a comprehensive report on the
quality of health care and recommends 6 visions of a transformed healthcare system,
including safe, effective, patient-centered, timely, efficient, and equitable care; and
Whereas, healthful lifestyle choices are implicit in Wisconsin's health plan
"Healthiest Wisconsin 2010"; now, therefore, be it

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*Resolved by the senate, That* the members of the Wisconsin senate encourage
all employers and employees to develop Healthy Lifestyles programs in their places
of work; and, be it further

*Resolved, That* the members of the Wisconsin senate encourage health care
 providers in Wisconsin to endorse and adopt the 6 visions of a transformed
 healthcare system developed by the Institute of Medicine; and, be it further

14 **Resolved, That** the members of the Wisconsin senate encourage Wisconsin's 15 schools to examine their curricula and programming and modify them as necessary 16 to incorporate nutritional education, physical education, and healthful living into 17 the education of Wisconsin's children; and, be it further

*Resolved, That* the members of the Wisconsin senate encourage economic
 incentives to stimulate widespread adoption of such workplace programs; and, be it
 further

*Resolved, That* the members of the Wisconsin senate appeal to the private
sector to encourage Wisconsin's communities, by all practical means, to champion
and facilitate healthful living for their citizens.
