Other than changing references from SHIP to SCHIP and spelling medical correctly in the last paragraph, the motion is accurate.

Jim Jones does have some suggestions for other points to include and other "asks" of Congress for your consideration. Right now, the resolution says to continue funding SCHIP "as is." You may want to ask for full funding (ie sum sufficient, not sum certain) for all states' efforts to cover uninsured and underinsured children up to 300 to 400 percent of the federal poverty level; Full funding for all states' efforts to cover the uninsured and underinsured parents and caregivers of those children up to 200 to 300 percent FPL and allow for innovate state practices to provide increased access to affordable health insurance for all low-income individuals.

This recognizes Congressional efforts to increase SCHIP funding and to fully fund what states are spending to provide coverage to low-income children and their parents. I believe it is a Clinton/Dingell bill that would increase SCHIP funding. SEIU has a national effort to push this. They are organized a press conference in Green Bay on Saturday with Congressman Kagen, fyi.

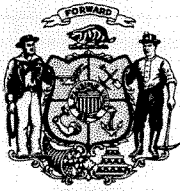
