6	Civic Action, a Latino and low–income civil rights organization based in Milwaukee;

8	Whereas, he is a former director and president of the Latin American Union for
9	Civil Rights in Milwaukee; and
10	Whereas, he organized a series of protests which led to the creation of the
11	Spanish Speaking Outreach Institute at the University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee;

13	Whereas, he co-founded Milwaukee's Mexican Fiesta in 1977; and
14	Whereas, he is a recipient of the UMOS Lifetime Achievement Award and the
15	Spanish Times Latino Leader of the Year Award; and

Whereas, he is a member of Stop Latino on Latino Violence and of the
 Committees on Civil Rights and Better Education; and

Whereas, in addition to his contributions to the people of Wisconsin, he compiled a distinguished record of service throughout America, culminating in his work as a consultant for the National Council of La Raza in Washington D.C.; now, therefore, be it

commemorate the service and contributions of Ernesto Chacon.
