

The changes addressed the comments of the program folks and office of general counsel. However, the program folks have a couple of additional comments:

- 1. It seems reasonable to me to make RPCs and Indian Tribes eligible applicants for non-infrastructure grants like training, planning, outreach, etc. uder sub (4). This would be similar to the Transportation Enhancements and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality programs.
- 2. Isn't sub (5) redundant? We would have to comply with federal requirements in order to receive the federal SR2S funding in any event. What is the value in having state law further also require that we comply with those same federal requirements?

So, if you could add MPOs/RPCs and Indian Tribes as eligible applicants for non-infrastructure projects (if they aren't already included under the current language), that would be great.

Regarding comment two, if this is just common statutory structure, we have no problem with it being in there.






