On behalf of the HEAB, I request draft language for the following proposed statutory changes. There are two attachments with this email. Thank you in advance for your assistance, and please call me at 264-6181 if you need further information.

3. New Program: Veterans' Tuition Remission Reimbursement

Problem: The 2005-07 budget (2005 Wisconsin Act 25) created a 50% tuition remission for certain veterans and a 100% tuition remission for certain dependents of veterans at UW System and Wisconsin Technical College System institutions. No general purpose revenue was provided to fund these remissions. In the spring of 2006, the Governor signed the Wisconsin GI Bill, which expanded the tuition remission for veterans to a 100% remission beginning in the 2007-08 academic year. As a result, the annual cost of the veterans' tuition remission program will increase significantly.

There is no appropriation ear-marked for this tuition remission. Additionally, there is no one agency responsible for the combined oversight of this program.

Solution: Create a new program, the Veterans' Tuition Remission Reimbursement, administered by HEAB. We view this as a combination of procedures currently used to administer the **39.47 Minnesota-Wisconsin Student Reciprocity Agreement** and the **39.41 Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarships**. Campuses would be responsible for certifying the eligibility of students as described under **36.27(3)(n)** and **36.27(3)(p)**, and **38.24(7)** and **38.24(8)**. Similar to the reciprocity agreement, each institution would certify to HEAB, at the end of each semester, the students who qualified for the remission, including number of credits and tuition. HEAB would reimburse the schools for the remitted tuition. The appropriation would be sum sufficient, as is the AES appropriation.

Additional Information: I have attached a copy of the letter from UW System and WTCS explaining this proposal. The Higher Educational Aids Board approved that this program be included in our biennial budget request.

Dear Board Chair Green and Executive Secretary Hutchison:

On behalf of the Wisconsin Technical College System Board, the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System and our students across the state, we respectfully ask that the Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) request sum sufficient funding and the necessary resources to administer a reimbursement program for tuition remissions for veterans and their dependents.

The 2005-07 budget (2005 Wisconsin Act 25) created a 50% tuition remission for certain veterans and a 100% tuition remission for certain dependents of veterans at UW System and Wisconsin Technical College System institutions. No general purpose revenue was provided to fund these remissions. Since the current tuition remission programs were established, the UW System has provided tuition remissions to 1,467 students at a cost of approximately \$4.3 million. The WTCS has provided tuition remissions to nearly 900 veterans or veterans' dependents at a cost of approximately \$765,000.

In the spring of 2006, the Governor signed the Wisconsin GI Bill, which expanded the tuition remission for veterans to a 100% remission beginning in the 2007-08 academic year. As a result, the annual cost of the veterans' tuition remission program will increase significantly. In addition, the cost of both remission programs could be expected to increase as the number of eligible veterans (and their dependents) rises in the next few years and if more of these students enroll full-time, increasing the annual value of their remissions. In addition, participation should increase in the next three years reflecting the cumulative effect of continuing participation and new enrollments.

Because of cost concerns, implementation of the 100% veteran tuition remission was delayed until the 2007-08 academic year to allow the UW System and the WTCS to seek GPR funding for this program in the 2007-09 biennial budget. When he signed the proposal into law, Governor Doyle stated that the veterans' tuition remission program would be a budget priority for 2007-09.

The WTCS Board and UW System Board of Regents believe that HEAB is the most appropriate entity to administer a reimbursement program for these tuition remissions. Central administration of these funds would provide a single point of contact for information about the


program, facilitate data collection and monitoring of program participation and costs, facilitate periodic program evaluation, and clearly restrict the use of funds to remission reimbursement. Moreover, HEAB has experience administering a similar type of reimbursement program with the Academic Excellence Scholarship.

In addition, since the level of participation is difficult to estimate, funding for tuition remissions for veterans and their dependents should be established in a sum sufficient appropriation. HEAB is also experienced in administering this type of appropriation. Funding is provided through sum sufficient appropriations administered by HEAB for fee reimbursements under the Minnesota-Wisconsin student reciprocity agreement, and for tuition grants under the Wisconsin Higher Education Grant for University of Wisconsin System students and the Academic Excellence Scholarship program.

Based on first year activity and anticipated increases in participation and tuition, the estimated amount needed for remissions awarded by WTCS is \$2,300,000 in FY 2007-08 and \$3,200,000 in FY 2007-09 for a total of \$5,500,000 over the biennium. The estimated amount needed for remissions awarded by UW System is \$9,263,900 in FY 2007-08 and \$9,912,400 in FY 2008-09 for a total of \$19,176,300 over the biennium.

Thank you considering this proposal for inclusion in HEAB's biennial budget request. Your willingness to administer this remission reimbursement program will ensure that important benefits for veterans and their dependents are sustained without increasing the financial burden of postsecondary education to non-veteran students.

Gordon, I have a few suggestions for changes to this draft. I thought I'd send them in an email rather than talk to you so that you can review them at your convenience.

- Page 2, line 5: I think "or" between (3p) and 38.24 should be "and." **OK**
- Page 3, line 8: I think you need to insert "or college campuses" after "institutions" in order to cover the 2-year schools. Also, on this line and on lines 10 and 13, do you think you need to add "or nonresident tuition" or do you think it's unnecessary? **I think the intent is tuition and remission for residents – not nonresidents. Maybe I don't understand the question, but I don't believe there would be nonresident tuition remission.**
- Page 3, line 12: I'd delete "account" here. I think it's OK to pay from an appropriation. **OK**
- Page 3, line 14: for what purpose are the amounts credited to this appropriation account? In other words, what does DOA want the UW to do with the money? Shouldn't it be used for whatever the fees, had they not been remitted, would have been used for? See 20.285 (1) (im). **Yes, I agree**
- Page 3, lines 16-17: I think the better way to say this is simply "attending the technical college" instead of "attending technical colleges within the district of the district board." **OK**

15 subsection to the appropriation under s. 20.285 (1) (k) and shall expend those
16 amounts received for degree credit instruction.

17 (2) TECHNICAL COLLEGES. At the end of each semester, each technical college
18 district board shall certify to the board the number of students enrolled in the
19 technical college governed by the district board to whom any fees have been remitted
20 under s. 38.24 (7) or (8), the number of credits for which those fees have been
21 remitted, and the amount of those fees remitted. If the board approves the
22 information certified under this subsection, the board, from the appropriation
23 account under s. 20.235 (1) (fz), shall reimburse the district board for the amount of
24 fees remitted.
