Audit Requirements for Agencies Receiving DHFS Funds

Current Language

Chapter 46.036(4)(c) applies to the department and to counties when the counties subcontract department funds. It states the following:

Unless waived by the department, biennially, or annually if required under federal law, provide the purchaser with a certified financial and compliance audit report if the care and services purchased exceed \$25,000. The audit shall follow standards that the department prescribes. A purchaser may waive the requirements of this paragraph for any family-operated group home, as defined under par. (a), from which it purchases services.

Proposed Change

Amend s. 46.036 to increase the threshold to \$100,000 with a provision allowing the department to establish a higher threshold by policy if circumstances show that a higher threshold is warranted.

Effect of the Change

Many audits of smaller, low risk agencies are likely to be eliminated under this proposal, which would reduce costs to programs and result in more funds being available for program activities. In addition, counties and the department would save some costs associated with the time that staff now invest in obtaining and reviewing audit reports of smaller, low risk agencies or in approving waivers of those audits.

Several of the department's policy documents would need minor adjustments to reflect a change in the statute:

- The Provider Agency Audit Guide and State Single Audit Guidelines would need changes
 to the discussion of when audits are required and the process for obtaining waivers of audit
 requirements.
- The department's annual memo to counties with instructions for waivers of audits would need to reflect the change.
- The department's model contracts and the guidance the department provides to counties to use when subcontracting department funds would need updates to the audit sections.

The statute allows the department to waive audits. The waivers save programs from having to bear the costs of audits. However, counties and the department are incurring costs associated with staff time for justifying these waivers.

Rationale for the Change

The current audit requirement is outdated and results in requiring costly audits when they are not needed. The current threshold is too low at \$25,000, requiring some smaller agencies to have audits that cost more than any benefits received from conducting the audits. This also adds to purchaser costs in obtaining and reviewing unneeded audits.

The statute includes a provision which allows the department to waive audits. According to the Office of Legal Counsel, this provision requiring each waiver must be considered individually. Obtaining individual waivers of audits for hundreds of very small agencies adds substantially to the workload for county and department staff.

Another consideration is a recent provision in Chapter 66 of the statutes. This provision allows individual counties to petition for waivers of mandates. The only petitions under this waiver that state agencies have approved are for raising the audit threshold in 46.036. Under this waiver, 25 counties now have audit thresholds at \$75,000 and, more recently, two counties have obtained thresholds of \$100,000. The experience with the mandate waiver provision shows general recognition that the current threshold is too low.


