Brief Description of Intent:

Under the TEACH program public schools, private schools, libraries, technical colleges, private colleges, juvenile correctional facilities, and state schools are eligible for state subsidized data and video circuits (the Telecommunications Access Program). The majority of the cost is covered by the state's Universal Service Fund (USF). On behalf of schools and libraries, the state then applies for a partial reimbursement of federal e-rate funds under 47 USC 254. These funds are placed in the appropriation under s.20.505(4)(mp) where they are used for administration of the Telecommunications Access Program and to reimburse telecommunications infrastructure costs under s. 20.505(4)(es) & (et). As the bonds for telecommunications infrastructure costs are retired, the state's payments under (es) & (et) decline and excess e-rate funds are generated. At the same time requests for data and video lines are increasing to the point where the state USF funds will be inadequate to meet demand.

The department wishes to modify the appropriation under s.20.505(4)(mp) to allow use of the erate funds to pay for additional telecommunications access to the extent that funds are available after meeting commitments for reimbursing costs incurred under s.20.505(4)(es) & (et). The use of these funds should be restricted to those educational entities eligible for e-rate funding under 47 USC 254.
