TITLE: INDEXING THE HOMESTEAD TAX CREDIT

In Tax Year 2008 begin indexing household income for the Homestead Tax Credit to inflation (71.54). The language should be similar to 71.05(22)(dt). Indexing should be based on Department of Labor consumer price index from August 2006.

Income taxation Under current law, for claims filed in 2001 and thereafter, the homestead tax credit threshold income is \$8,000, the maximum property taxes, or rent constituting property taxes, that a claimant may use in calculating his or her credit are \$1,450, and the maximum household income is \$24,500. Under the current law formula, as a claimant's income exceeds \$8,000, the credit is phased out until the credit equals zero when income exceeds \$24,500. Also under the formula, if the household income is \$8,000 or less, the credit is 80 percent of the property taxes accrued or rent constituting property taxes accrued. Using the formula, the credit that may be claimed ranges from \$10 to \$1,160.

Under this bill, for claims filed in 2009 and thereafter, the maximum household income is indexed for inflation. Also under the bill, as a claimant's income exceeds the threshold income amount the credit is phased out until the credit equals zero when income exceeds the maximum income as adjusted for inflation.
