12 under a cash optimization program administered by the building commission, to be
13 used for transportation facilities under s. 84.01 (28) and major highway projects for
14 the purposes under ss. 84.06 and 84.09. In addition to the foregoing limit on principal
15 amount, the building commission may contract revenue obligations under this
16 section as the building commission determines is desirable to refund outstanding
17 revenue obligations contracted under this section, to make payments under
18 agreements or ancillary arrangements entered into under s. 18.55 (6) with respect
19 to revenue obligations issued under this section, and to pay expenses associated with
20 revenue obligations contracted under this section.
