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

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

SECTION 1. 120.13 (18m) of the statutes is created to read:

120.13 (18m) RENEWABLE RESOURCE FACILITIES.

As adopted in 2005 Act 141, section 196.374(1)(j) provides as follows:

s. 196.374(1)(j). "Renewable resource" means a resource that derives energy from any source other than coal, petroleum products, nuclear power, or, except as used in a fuel cell, natural gas.

"Renewable resource" includes resources deriving energy from any of the following:

1. Solar energy.
2. Wind Power.
3. Water Power.
4. Biomass.
5. Geothermal technology.
6. Tidal or wave action.
7. Fuel cell technology that uses, as determined by the commission, a renewable fuel.
