Under current law, the Wisconsin Department of Commerce is required to collect and maintain records of all fires that occur in the State of Wisconsin. However, the Commerce Department is not required to maintain any records in regards to how or why a certain fire is started. They are also not required to report whether or not the proper safety precautions were taken to prevent a fire.

This bill requires all fire departments to report certain information to the Department of Commerce when they report building fires. The information required includes the following; the cause of the fire, the age and purpose of the building, the number of units in the building contains two or more dwelling units, and the existence of any fire sprinklers or fire alarm systems.

Such a collection of information could help prevent household and commercial property fires in the future. The data collected will also assist builders, realtors, insurance agents, and fire department personnel to better inform themselves and potential costumers of how to prepare their structures for fire prevention.
