Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill eliminates a statutory provision at sec. 978.12 (1) (b), Wis. Stats., which limits the maximum pay rate of a Deputy District Attorney (DDA) to the maximum of any pay range to which assistant district attorney positions are assigned.

Non-Limited Term Employment DDA's are otherwise covered by the provisions of Sections C, I, and J of the non-represented Compensation Plan administered by the Office of State Employment Relations.

In that none of the afore-mentioned Compensation Plan sections provide for DDA pay rate changes as a result of this bill's provisions, there are no additional costs directly related to the statutory change included in this bill.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The Office of State Employment Relations does not anticipate any long range fiscal impact from this proposed bill.
