1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 343.10 (5) (a) 3. of the statutes; **relating to:** occupational
2 licenses for certain offenders (suggested as remedial legislation by the
3 Department of Transportation).

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 343.10 (5) (a) 3. of the statutes is amended to read:
5 343.10 (5) (a) 3. If the applicant has 2 or more prior convictions, suspensions,
6 or revocations, as counted under s. 343.307 (1), the occupational license of the
7 applicant shall restrict the applicant's operation under the occupational license to
8 vehicles that are equipped with a functioning ignition interlock device if the court
9 has ordered under s. 343.301 (1) ~~that each motor vehicle for which the person's name~~
10 ~~appears on the vehicle's certificate of title or registration be~~ (a) 1. or 2. that the

1 person's operating privilege for Class D vehicles be restricted to operating vehicles
2 that are equipped with an ignition interlock device or has ordered under s. 346.65
3 (6) (a) 1., 1999 stats., that the motor vehicle owned by the person and used in the
4 violation or improper refusal be equipped with an ignition interlock device. A person
5 to whom a restriction under this subdivision applies violates that restriction if he or
6 she requests or permits another to blow into an ignition interlock device or to start
7 a motor vehicle equipped with an ignition interlock device for the purpose of
8 providing the person an operable motor vehicle without the necessity of first
9 submitting a sample of his or her breath to analysis by the ignition interlock device.
10 If the occupational license restricts the applicant's operation to a vehicle that is
11 equipped with an ignition interlock device, the applicant shall be liable for the
12 reasonable costs of equipping the vehicle with the ignition interlock device.
