



2007 SENATE BILL 300

1 **AN ACT relating to:** repealing, consolidating, renumbering, amending, and
2 revising various provisions of the statutes for the purpose of correcting errors,
3 supplying omissions, correcting and clarifying references, eliminating defects,
4 anachronisms, conflicts, ambiguities, and obsolete provisions, reconciling
5 conflicts, and repelling unintended repeals (Revisor's Correction Bill).

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

6 **SECTION 1.** 5.90 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451, is
7 amended to read:
8 5.90 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subchapter, recounts of votes cast
9 on an electronic voting system shall be conducted in the manner prescribed in s. 9.01.
10 Except as provided in sub. (2) and s. 9.01 (1) (b) 8s., if the ballots are distributed to

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1 the electors, the board of canvassers shall recount the ballots with automatic
2 tabulating equipment. The board of canvassers shall test the automatic tabulating
3 equipment to be used prior to the recount as provided in s. 5.84, and then the official
4 ballots or the record of the votes cast shall be recounted on the automatic tabulating
5 equipment. In addition, the board of canvassers shall check the ballots for the
6 presence or absence of the initials and other distinguishing marks, shall examine the
7 ballots marked “Rejected”, “Defective” and “Objected to” to determine the propriety
8 of such labels, and shall compare the “Duplicate Overvoted Ballots” and “Duplicate
9 Damaged Ballots” with their respective originals to determine the correctness of the
10 duplicates. If electronic voting machines are used, the board of canvassers shall
11 perform the recount using the permanent paper record of the votes cast by each
12 elector, as generated by the machines.

13 **SECTION 2.** 6.29 (2) (am) of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451,
14 is amended to read:

15 6.29 (2) (am) The board shall provide to each municipal clerk a list prepared
16 for use at each municipal clerk’s office showing the name and address of each person
17 whose name appears on the list provided by the department of corrections under s.
18 301.03 (~~20~~) (20m) as ineligible to vote on the date of the election, whose address is
19 located in the municipality, and whose name does not appear on the registration list
20 for that municipality. Prior to permitting an elector to register to vote under this
21 subsection, the municipal clerk shall review the list. If the name of an elector who
22 wishes to register to vote appears on the list, the municipal clerk shall inform the
23 elector that the elector is ineligible to register to vote. If the elector maintains that
24 he or she is eligible to vote in the election, the municipal clerk shall permit the elector

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1 to register to vote but shall mark the elector’s registration form as “ineligible to vote
2 per Department of Corrections.” If the elector wishes to vote, the municipal clerk
3 shall challenge the elector’s ballot in the same manner as provided for inspectors who
4 challenge ballots under s. 6.79 (2) (dm).

(20m) by this bill.

5 **SECTION 3.** 6.33 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451, is
6 amended to read:

7 **6.33 (1)** The board shall prescribe the format, size, and shape of registration
8 forms. All forms shall be printed on cards and each item of information shall be of
9 uniform font size, as prescribed by the board. The municipal clerk shall supply
10 sufficient ~~form~~ forms to meet voter registration needs. The forms shall be designed
11 to obtain from each applicant information as to name; date; residence location;
12 citizenship; date of birth; age; the number of a valid operator’s license issued to the
13 elector under ch. 343 or the last 4 digits of the elector’s social security account
14 number; whether the applicant has resided within the ward or election district for
15 at least 10 days; whether the applicant has been convicted of a felony for which he
16 or she has not been pardoned, and if so, whether the applicant is incarcerated, or on
17 parole, probation, or extended supervision; whether the applicant is disqualified on
18 any other ground from voting; and whether the applicant is currently registered to
19 vote at any other location. The form shall include a space for the applicant’s
20 signature and the signature of any corroborating elector. The form shall include a
21 space to enter the name of any special registration deputy under s. 6.26 or 6.55 (6)
22 or inspector, municipal clerk, or deputy clerk under s. 6.55 (2) who obtains the form
23 and a space for the deputy, inspector, clerk, or deputy clerk to sign his or her name,
24 affirming that the deputy, inspector, clerk, or deputy clerk has accepted the form.

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1 The form shall include a space for entry of the ward and aldermanic district, if any,
2 where the elector resides and any other information required to determine the offices
3 and referenda for which the elector is certified to vote. The form shall also include
4 a space where the clerk may record an indication of whether the form is received by
5 mail, a space where the clerk may record an indication of the type of identifying
6 document submitted by the elector as proof of residence under s. 6.34, whenever
7 required, and a space where the clerk, for any applicant who possesses a valid voting
8 identification card issued to the person under s. 6.47 (3), may record the
9 identification serial number appearing on the voting identification card. Each
10 county clerk shall obtain sufficient registration forms for completion by an elector
11 who desires to register to vote at the office of the county clerk under s. 6.28 (4).

12 **SECTION 4.** 6.36 (1) (a) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451,
13 is amended to read:

14 6.36 (1) (a) The board shall compile and maintain electronically an official
15 registration list. The list shall contain the name and address of each registered
16 elector in the state, the date of birth of the elector, the ward and aldermanic district
17 of the elector, if any, and, for each elector, a unique registration identification number
18 assigned by the board, the number of a valid operator's license issued to the elector
19 under ch. 343, if any, or the last 4 digits of the elector's social security account
20 number, if any, any identification serial number issued to the elector under s. 6.47
21 (3), the date of any election in which the elector votes, an indication of whether the
22 elector is a military elector, as defined in sub. (2) (c), who has so certified under s.
23 6.865 (3m), an indication of whether the elector is an overseas elector, as defined in
24 s. 6.24 (1), any information relating to the elector that appears on the current list

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1 transmitted to the board by the department of corrections under s. 301.03 ~~(20)~~ (20m),
2 an indication of any accommodation required under s. 5.25 (4) (a) to permit voting
3 by the elector, an indication of the method by which the elector’s registration form
4 was received, and such other information as may be determined by the board to
5 facilitate administration of elector registration requirements.

6 **SECTION 5.** 6.55 (2) (cs) of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451,
7 is amended to read:

8 6.55 (2) (cs) The board shall provide to each municipal clerk a list prepared for
9 use at each polling place showing the name and address of each person whose name
10 appears on the list provided by the department of corrections under s. 301.03 ~~(20)~~
11 (20m) as ineligible to vote on the date of the election, whose address is located in the
12 area served by that polling place, and whose name does not appear on the poll list
13 for that polling place. Prior to permitting an elector to register to vote under this
14 subsection or s. 6.86 (3) (a) 2., the inspectors or special registration deputies shall
15 review the list. If the name of an elector who wishes to register to vote appears on
16 the list, the inspectors or special registration deputies shall inform the elector or the
17 elector’s agent that the elector is ineligible to register to vote. If the elector or the
18 elector’s agent maintains that the elector is eligible to vote in the election, the
19 inspectors or special registration deputies shall permit the elector to register but
20 shall mark the elector’s registration form as “ineligible to vote per Department of
21 Corrections.” If the elector wishes to vote, the inspectors shall require the elector to
22 vote by ballot and shall challenge the ballot as provided in s. 6.79 (2) (dm).

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1 **SECTION 6.** 6.79 (2) (d) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451,
2 is amended to read:

3 6.79 (2) (d) ~~The~~ If the poll list indicates that proof of residence under s. 6.34 is
4 required, the officials shall require the elector to provide proof of residence. If proof
5 of residence is provided, the officials shall verify that the name and address on the
6 identification document submitted as proof of residence provided is the same as the
7 name and address shown on the registration list. If proof of residence is required and
8 not provided, the officials shall offer the opportunity for the elector to vote under s.
9 6.97.

10 **SECTION 7.** 6.79 (2) (dm) of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451,
11 is amended to read:

12 6.79 (2) (dm) If the poll list indicates that the elector is ineligible to vote because
13 the elector’s name appears on the current list provided by the department of
14 corrections under s. 301.03 ~~(20)~~ (20m), the inspectors shall inform the elector of this
15 fact. If the elector maintains that he or she is eligible to vote in the election, the
16 inspectors shall provide the elector with a ballot and, after the elector casts his or her
17 vote, shall challenge the ballot as provided in s. 6.92 and treat the ballot in the
18 manner provided in s. 6.95.

NOTE: Section 301.03 (20), as created by 2005 Wis. Act 451, is renumbered s. 301.03
(20m) by this bill.

19 **SECTION 8.** The treatment of 6.875 (4) of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin Act 149
20 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 6.875 (4) reads:
(4) (a) For the purpose of absentee voting in nursing homes and qualified
retirement homes and qualified community-based residential facilities, the municipal
clerk or board of election commissioners of each municipality in which one or more
nursing homes or qualified retirement homes or qualified community-based residential
facilities are located shall appoint at least 2 special voting deputies for the municipality.

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Upon application under s. 6.86 (1), (2), or (2m) by one or more qualified electors who are occupants of a nursing home or qualified retirement home or qualified community-based residential facility, the municipal clerk or board of election commissioners of the municipality in which the home or facility is located shall dispatch 2 special voting deputies to visit the home or qualified community-based residential facility for the purpose of supervising absentee voting procedure by occupants of the home or qualified community-based residential facility. The clerk shall maintain a list, available to the public upon request, of each nursing home or qualified retirement home or qualified community-based residential facility where an elector has requested an absentee ballot. The list shall include the date and time the deputies intend to visit each home or facility. The 2 deputies designated to visit each nursing home or qualified retirement home and qualified community-based residential facility shall be affiliated with different political parties whenever deputies representing different parties are available.

(b) Nominations for the special voting deputy positions described in par. (a) may be submitted by the 2 recognized political parties whose candidates for governor or president received the greatest numbers of votes in the municipality at the most recent general election. The deputies shall be specially appointed to carry out the duties under par. (a) for the period specified in s. 7.30 (6) (a). The clerk or board of election commissioners may revoke an appointment at any time. No individual who is employed or retained, or within the 2 years preceding appointment has been employed or retained, at a nursing home or qualified retirement home or qualified community-based residential facility in the municipality, or any member of the individual's immediate family, as defined in s. 19.42 (7), may be appointed to serve as a deputy.

1 **SECTION 9.** The treatment of 6.875 (6) (a) of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin Act
2 149, section 24, is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451, section 86. Both
3 treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 6.875 (6) (a) reads:

(a) Special voting deputies in each municipality shall, not later than 5 p.m. on the Friday preceding an election, arrange one or more convenient times with the administrator of each nursing home, qualified retirement home, and qualified community-based residential facility in the municipality from which one or more occupants have filed an application under s. 6.86 to conduct absentee voting for the election. The time may be no earlier than the 4th Monday preceding the election and no later than 5 p.m. on the Monday preceding the election. The municipal clerk shall post a notice at the home or facility indicating the date and time that absentee voting will take place at that home or facility. The notice shall be posted as soon as practicable after arranging the visit but in no case less than 24 hours before the visit. At the designated time, 2 deputies appointed under sub. (4) shall visit the home or facility.

4 **SECTION 10.** 6.875 (6) (b) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act 149,
5 section 24, and 2005 Wisconsin Act 451, section 86, is amended to read:

6 **6.875 (6) (b)** The municipal clerk or executive director of the board of election
7 commissioners shall issue a supply of absentee ballots to the deputies sufficient to
8 provide for the number of valid applications for an absentee ballot received by the

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1 clerk, and a reasonable additional number of ballots. The deputies may exercise the
2 authority granted to the chief inspector under s. 7.41 to regulate the conduct of
3 observers ~~for.~~ For purposes of the application of s. 7.41, the home or facility shall be
4 treated as a polling place. The municipal clerk or executive director shall keep a
5 careful record of all ballots issued to the deputies and shall require the deputies to
6 return every ballot issued to them.

NOTE: Corrects punctuation error that results in an incomplete sentence. Drafting
records for 2005 Wis. Act 451 show that 2 sentences were intended.

7 **SECTION 11.** The treatment of 7.08 (1) (c) of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin Act
8 278 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 7.08 (1) (c)
reads:

(c) Prescribe forms required by ss. 6.24 (3) and (4), 6.30 (4), 6.33 (1), 6.40 (1) (a),
6.47 (1) (am) 2. and (3), 6.55 (2), and 6.86 (2) to (3). All such forms shall contain a
statement of the penalty applicable to false or fraudulent registration or voting through
use of the form. Forms are not required to be furnished by the board.

9 **SECTION 12.** The treatment of 7.30 (4) (b) (intro.) of the statutes by 2005
10 Wisconsin Act 149 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 7.30 (4) (b)
(intro.) reads:

(b) The 2 dominant parties, under sub. (2), are each responsible for submitting a
list of names from which all appointees to inspector positions, other than appointees to
inspector positions authorized under sub. (1) (b), shall be chosen as follows:

11 **SECTION 13.** The treatment of 7.30 (4) (b) 2. of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin
12 Act 149 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor s. 7.30 (4) (b) 2.
reads:

2. a. In municipalities other than cities and villages located in counties having a
population of more than 500,000, the committees organized under s. 8.17 from each of the
2 dominant parties under sub. (2) shall submit a list containing at least as many names
as there are needed appointees from that party. The list shall be submitted by the
chairperson of each of the 2 committees to the mayor, president, or chairperson of the
municipality. If committees are organized in subdivisions of a city, the list shall be
submitted through the chairperson of the city committee. If there is no municipal
committee, the list shall be submitted by the chairperson of the county or legislative
district committee. Except as provided in par. (c), only those persons submitted by the
chairperson of each committee under s. 8.17 may act as election officials. The chairperson
may designate any individual whose name is submitted as a first choice nominee. The
list shall contain the signature of the chairperson and secretary of the submitting
committee.

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b. In cities or villages located in counties having a population of more than 500,000, other than cities where there is a board of election commissioners, the aldermanic district or village committeeman or committeewoman for the ward or wards where each polling place is located, if there is one, or for inspectors serving under s. 7.52 (1) (b), the committeemen and committeewomen for the municipality acting jointly, shall submit a list containing at least as many names as there are needed appointees for inspector positions from the party represented by the committeeman or committeewoman or by the committeemen and committeewomen acting jointly. For appointments of inspectors in cities and villages where there is no aldermanic district or village committeeman or committeewoman, nominations shall proceed in the same manner as in municipalities located in counties having a population of 500,000 or less. The list shall be submitted to the mayor or president. Except as provided in par. (c), only those persons whose names are submitted as provided in this paragraph may act as election officials. The committeeman or committeewoman may designate any individual whose name is submitted as a first choice nominee. The list shall contain the signature of the aldermanic district or village committeeman or committeewoman or the chairperson of the appropriate committee.

c. Upon submission of each nominee's name, the governing body shall appoint each first choice nominee for so long as positions are available, unless nonappointment is authorized under par. (e), and shall appoint other nominees in its discretion. If any nominee is not appointed, the mayor, president, or chairperson of the municipality shall immediately nominate another person from the appropriate lists submitted and continue until the necessary number of election officials from each party is achieved at that meeting.

1 **SECTION 14.** 7.51 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451, is

2 amended to read:

3 **7.51 (1) CANVASS PROCEDURE.** Immediately after the polls close the inspectors
4 except any inspector appointed under s. 7.30 (1) (b) shall proceed to canvass publicly
5 all votes received at the polling place. In any municipality where an electronic voting
6 system is used, the municipal governing body or board of election commissioners may
7 provide or authorize the municipal clerk or executive director of the board of election
8 commissioners to provide for the adjournment of the canvass to one or more central
9 counting locations for specified polling places in the manner prescribed in subch. III
10 of ch. 5. No central counting location may be used to count votes at a polling place
11 where an electronic voting system is not employed. The canvass, whether conducted
12 at the polling place or at a central counting location, shall continue without
13 adjournment until the canvass is completed and the return statement is made or, in
14 municipalities where absentee ballots are canvassed under s. 7.52, until the canvass

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1 of all ballots cast is completed and the return statement for those ballots ~~are~~ is made.
2 The inspectors shall not permit access to the name of any elector who has obtained
3 a confidential listing under s. 6.47 (2) during the canvass, except as authorized in s.
4 6.47 (8).

5 **SECTION 15.** 7.53 (2) (a) 3. of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451,
6 is amended to read:

7 7.53 (2) (a) 3. If the clerk is a candidate at an election being canvassed, the clerk
8 may perform his or her duties on the board of canvassers only if the clerk does not
9 have an opponent whose name appears on the ballot, or in the case of a recount, if
10 the office the clerk is seeking is not a subject of the recount. If the clerk is a candidate
11 at the election being canvassed and has an opponent whose name appears on the
12 ballot or if the office the clerk is seeking is a subject of a recount, the mayor, president
13 of or board chairperson of the municipality shall designate another qualified elector
14 of the municipality to serve in lieu of the elector for that election.

NOTE: Inserts correct word.

15 **SECTION 16.** The treatment of 9.01 (1) (a) of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin Act
16 149 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 451. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 9.01 (1) (a)
reads:

(a) 1. Any candidate voted for at any election or any elector who voted upon any referendum question at any election may petition for a recount. The petitioner shall file a verified petition or petitions with the proper clerk or body under par. (ar) not earlier than the time of completion of the canvass and not later than 5 p.m. on the 3rd business day following the last meeting day of the municipal or county board of canvassers determining the election for that office or on that referendum question prior to issuance of any amended return under s. 6.221 (6) (b) or, if more than one board of canvassers makes the determination, not later than 5 p.m. on the 3rd business day following the last meeting day of the last board of canvassers which makes a determination prior to issuance of any amended return under s. 6.221 (6) (b). If the chairperson of the board or chairperson’s designee makes the determination for the office or the referendum question, the petitioner shall file the petition not earlier than the last meeting day of the last county board of canvassers to make a statement in the election or referendum and not later than 5 p.m. on the 3rd business day following the day on which the elections

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board receives the last statement from a county board of canvassers for the election or referendum.

2. Each verified petition under subd. 1. shall state all of the following:

a. That at the election the petitioner was a candidate for the office in question or that the petitioner voted on the referendum question in issue.

b. That the petitioner is informed and believes that a mistake or fraud has been committed in a specified ward or municipality in the counting and return of the votes cast for the office or upon the question or that another specified defect, irregularity, or illegality occurred in the conduct of the election.

3. The petition under subd. 1. shall specify each ward, or each municipality where no wards exist, in which a recount is desired. If a recount is requested for all wards within a jurisdiction, each ward need not be specified.

4. The petition under subd. 1. may be amended to include information discovered as a result of the investigation of the board of canvassers or the chairperson of the board, or chairperson's designee, after the filing of the petition if the petitioner moves to amend the petition as soon as possible after the petitioner discovers, or reasonably should have discovered, the information that is the subject of the amendment and if the petitioner was unable to include the information in the original petition.

1 **SECTION 17.** The treatment of 13.94 (4) (a) 1. of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin
2 Act 335 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 441. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 13.94 (4) (a) 1. reads:

1. Every state department, board, examining board, affiliated credentialing board, commission, independent agency, council or office in the executive branch of state government; all bodies created by the legislature in the legislative or judicial branch of state government; any public body corporate and politic created by the legislature including specifically the Fox River Navigational System Authority and the Wisconsin Aerospace Authority, a professional baseball park district, a local professional football stadium district, a local cultural arts district and a family care district under s. 46.2895; every Wisconsin works agency under subch. III of ch. 49; every provider of medical assistance under subch. IV of ch. 49; technical college district boards; development zones designated under s. 560.71; every county department under s. 51.42 or 51.437; every nonprofit corporation or cooperative or unincorporated cooperative association to which moneys are specifically appropriated by state law; and every corporation, institution, association or other organization which receives more than 50% of its annual budget from appropriations made by state law, including subgrantee or subcontractor recipients of such funds.

3 **SECTION 18.** 16.964 (12) (k) of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act
4 25, is amended to read:

5 16.964 (12) (k) By December 31, 2011, the office, in collaboration with the
6 departments of corrections and health and family services, shall submit a report to
7 the chief clerk of each house of the legislature, for distribution to the appropriate
8 standing committees under section s. 13.172 (3), regarding savings that have been
9 generated through the implementation of the grant program. The report shall also

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1 include recommendations regarding how the grant program should be structured in
2 the future.

3 **SECTION 19.** 19.01 (4) (g) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 19.01 (4) (g) Official oaths and bonds of all elected or appointed village officers
5 shall be filed in the office of the village clerk for the village in which the ~~officers~~ officer
6 serves, except that oaths and bonds of village clerks shall be filed in the office of the
7 village treasurer.

8 **SECTION 20.** 19.82 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

9 19.82 (2) “Meeting” means the convening of members of a governmental body
10 for the purpose of exercising the responsibilities, authority, power or duties
11 delegated to or vested in the body. If one-half or more of the members of a
12 governmental body are present, the meeting is rebuttably presumed to be for the
13 purpose of exercising the responsibilities, authority, power or duties delegated to or
14 vested in the body. The term does not include any social or chance gathering or
15 conference which is not intended to avoid this subchapter, any gathering of the
16 members of a town board for the purpose specified in s. 60.50 (6), any gathering of
17 the commissioners of a town sanitary district for the purpose specified in s. 60.77 (5)
18 (k), or any gathering of the members of a drainage board created under s. 88.16, 1991
19 stats., or under s. 88.17, for a purpose specified in s. 88.065 (5) (a).

20 **SECTION 21.** The treatment of 20.566 (1) (hp) of the statutes by 2005 Wisconsin
21 Act 323 is not repealed by 2005 Wisconsin Act 460. Both treatments stand.

NOTE: There is no conflict of substance. As merged by the revisor, s. 20.566 (1) (hp)
reads:

(hp) *Administration of endangered resources; professional football district; breast cancer research; fire fighters memorial; veterans trust fund; multiple sclerosis programs; prostate cancer research voluntary payments.* The amounts in the schedule for the

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payment of all administrative costs, including data processing costs, incurred in administering ss. 71.10 (5), (5e), (5f), (5fm), (5g), (5h), and (5m), and 71.30 (10). All moneys specified for deposit in this appropriation under ss. 71.10 (5) (h) 5., (5e) (h) 4., (5f) (i), (5fm) (i), (5g) (i), (5h) (i), and (5m) (i), and 71.30 (10) (i) and (11) (i) shall be credited to this appropriation.

1 **SECTION 22.** 20.835 (2) (bm) of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act
2 405, is renumbered 20.835 (2) (br).
