Doug Parrott:

Current law does not contain a clear prohibition against minors donating blood. Current law just provides that a person 17 years old or older may donate blood in a "noncompensatory" program. Do you want to provide that a person under 16 years old may not donate blood? If you elect to keep the current law authorization, as modified for 16-year-olds, do you want to maintain the qualification that it only applies if the donation is not compensated?

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
