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

1 AN ACT *to amend* 341.14 (1a), 341.14 (1e) (a), 341.14 (1m), 341.14 (1q) and 343.51
2 (1) of the statutes; **relating to:** obtaining a special registration plate for
3 disabled persons.✓

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person may obtain a special registration plate or temporary certification that allows the person to park in spaces reserved for disabled drivers if the person provides the Department of Transportation with certification from a physician, an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state, a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or a Christian Science practitioner stating that the person has a disability that limits his or her ability to walk. This bill allows a public health nurse to provide the necessary certification to enable a person to obtain a special registration plate or temporary certification for disabled drivers.✓

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 SECTION 1. 341.14 (1a) of the statutes is amended to read:
5 341.14 (1a) If any resident of this state, who is registering or has registered an
6 automobile, or a motor truck, dual purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck

22 health nurse certified or licensed to practice in any state. ✓ from a physician assistant
23 licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice
24 chiropractic in any state, from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state
25 and listed in the Christian Science journal, or from the U.S. department of veterans

1 affairs certifying to the department that the resident is a person with a disability
2 that limits or impairs the ability to walk, the department shall procure, issue and

17 any state,[✓] from an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state,
18 from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a
19 chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or from a Christian
20 Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian Science journal
21 certifying that another person who is regularly dependent on the licensed driver for
22 transportation is a person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk,
23 the department shall issue and deliver to the licensed driver plates of a special design
24 in lieu of the plates which ordinarily would be issued for the automobile or motor
25 truck, dual purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck having a gross weight

5 is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a). No charge in addition
6 to the registration fee may be made for the issuance or renewal of the plates. The

8 **SECTION 4.** 341.14 (1q) of the statutes is amended to read:

9 341.14 (1q) If any employer who provides an automobile, or a motor truck, dual
10 purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck which has a gross weight of not more
11 than 8,000 pounds, a farm truck which has a gross weight of not more than 12,000
12 pounds or a motor home, for an employee's use submits to the department a
13 statement once every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician
14 licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed
15 to practice nursing in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to
16 practice in any state. from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in
17 any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, or from
18 a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian
19 Science journal certifying that the employee is a person with a disability that limits
20 or impairs the ability to walk, the department shall issue and deliver to such
21 employer plates of a special design in lieu of the plates which ordinarily would be
22 issued for the vehicle, and shall renew the plates. The plates shall be so designed as
23 to readily apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the vehicle is operated by
24 a disabled person and is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a).

2 of the plates. The plates shall conform to the plates required in sub. (1a).

3 **SECTION 5.** 343.51 (1) [✓] of the statutes is amended to read:

4 343.51 (1) Any person who qualifies for registration plates of a special design
5 under s. 341.14 (1), (1a), (1m) or (1q) or any other person with a disability that limits
6 or impairs the ability to walk may request from the department a special
7 identification card that will entitle any motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle,
8 parked by, or under the direction of, the person, or a motor vehicle, other than a
9 motorcycle, operated by or on behalf of the organization when used to transport such
10 a person, to parking privileges under s. 346.50 (2), (2a) and (3). The department shall
11 issue the card at a fee to be determined by the department, upon submission by the
12 applicant, if the applicant is an individual rather than an organization, of a
13 statement from a physician licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an
14 advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, from a public
15 health nurse certified or licensed to practice in any state. [✓] from a physician assistant
16 licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice
17 chiropractic in any state, or from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this
18 state and listed in the Christian Science journal that the person is a person with a
19 disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk. The statement shall state
20 whether the disability is permanent or temporary and, if temporary, the opinion of
21 the physician, advanced practice nurse, public health nurse. [✓] physician assistant,
22 chiropractor or practitioner as to the duration of the disability. The department shall
23 issue the card upon application by an organization on a form prescribed by the
